CORONATION REFLECTIONS

Nothing in the Coronation service impressed us more deeply than the Queen's act as she laid the crown aside to kneel at the altar for the Holy Sacrament.

There were four significant features in the Queen's action. First, there was the acknowledgment of Jesus Christ as King of Kings and Lord of Lords.

The rich symbolism of the whole service brought home to our hearts the realities underlying sovereignty.

Parliaments will enact laws and decide on policies, and executives will work out their implications.

At every turn in the service, justice and mercy were the ideal.

In any nation's life the maintenance of justice and the securing of the rights of the people are the first obligation of government.

It is also necessary that the full power of the ruler be turned against evil, and that wrongdoers be brought to book.
