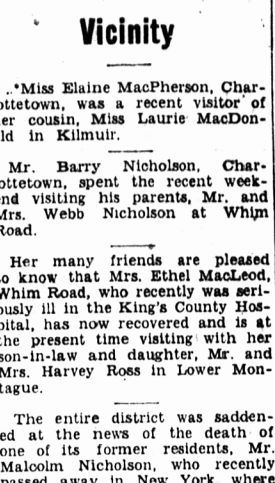

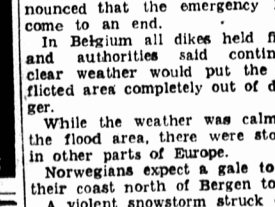

Continued from page 2 anic garden in the New World. It is truly a breath-taking garden, the spacious lawns, the variety of plant material and the meticulous perfection of maintenance.

In Haiti is the famous plantation that produces cut flowers and fresh vegetables for the great cities of the Caribbean. Home to the most part, are crowded into indeterminate thickets where the jungle presses in upon the clean-swept yards that surround the small dwellings of limestone or wattle.
