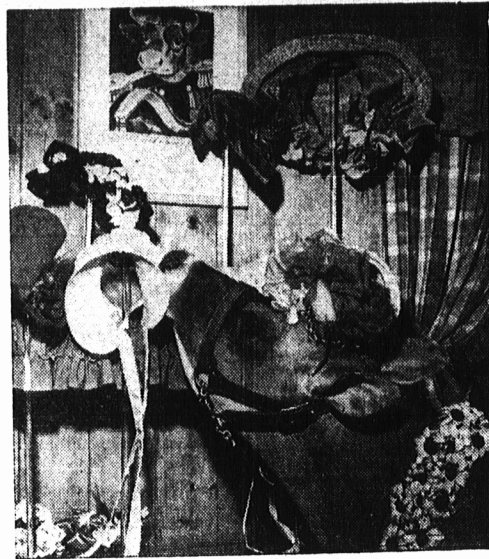

Montague Town Council Meeting

Routine business was transacted last evening at the regular monthly meeting of the Montague Town Council. The meeting was presided over by the Mayor, B. H. Yeo. Present were Councillors Jamieson, Hessian, Nicholson, MacLeod, and Reynolds.

Following the reading of the minutes, the bills were read and ordered paid. Correspondence was also read. Councillor Nicholson reported that the Fire Department had acquired a truck for the chemical, and that it was being outfitted to become a fire fighting unit carrying ladders, hose and all other necessary equipment.

Mr. Les MacLeod was appointed chairman of the sanitation committee and it was moved that a sanitary engineer be brought to Montague to inspect the town regarding sanitation.

It was decided that action against delinquent tax payers would be proceeded with in the next week or two as soon as court arrangements were completed, unless such tax arrears were paid during the interim.
