### WAR NEWS.

Greeks Preparing for the Inevitable.

Rumored Flight of Crown Prince Constantine

ATHENS, April 27.—King George has assured Premier Delyanis that he is prepared to approve any decision which the Government might reach with a view to the improvement of the situation.

LONDON, April 27.—The Times correspondent at Larissa, telegraphing on Sunday evening, says that the town was occupied by the Turkish cavalry at six o'clock this morning. The Greek troops fled in a panic at the moment the Ottoman troops entered in triumph playing and banners waving. The town will be held by a small garrison.

ATHENS, April 27.—A despatch from Tyrnovo says that it is rumored that the Crown Prince Constantine has fled to Volon.

### NEWS FROM THE CAPITAL

Cartwright's Apology for the Tariff.

SIR CHARLES TUPPER IN REPLY.

Arrival of Tariff Delegations at Ottawa.

OTTAWA, April 27.—Sir Richard Cartwright devoted an hour yesterday afternoon to the budget. He avoided much reference to his own pledges, but confined himself mostly to an exposition of the good points of the measure before the House. He dwelt particularly on the most favored sections, expressing the opinion that they would stand an international test. But if the British Government should object to the system, the Canadian Government would endeavor to persuade the home authorities and would fight the matter out. If the treaties were an obstacle, it would be their duty to try to have such treaties abrogated.

Sir Charles Tupper, in reply, made a three hours' speech of great force and effect. He arraigned the new tariff measure as a breach of the Imperial obligations, and a most unwise throwing away of a grand opportunity for a British Zollverein.

Delegations are already coming to ask for tariff amendments. A strong delegation of the iron men from Montreal and other cities arrived yesterday. One representing the tobacco manufacturers of Montreal, Kingston, Quebec, Toronto and London is also here. The town will swarm with delegations before the week is out.

Hon. Mr. Fielding replied to a request of the Montreal delegation for the appointment of an hour for an interview, that he could not see a delegation but would consider their written statement. But he is not to get off that way.

### AN EXPLOSION IN LONDON.

Underground Train Wrecked.

Passengers Wounded and Bleeding.

LONDON, April 28.—A terrible explosion occurred in the underground railway yesterday. As a train filled with men was making a stop at Alder's Gate Station the first-class coach was wrecked, and its occupants were found lying around bleeding. It is thought that the explosion was caused by a bomb.
