Official Returns For Prince County Reported

Dr. Orville Phillips, Progressive Conservative, won the Prince County riding from Liberal J. Watson MacNaught with a majority of 234 votes, according to declaration day results taken by returning officer, W. L. Delaney yesterday.

Returns indicated 102 rejected ballots, with the candidates totals as follows: MacNaught (L.—7,885; Phillips (P.C.—8,119; MacInnis (CCF)—339.

The Canadian Forces and Veterans' voting gave MacNaught 350; Phillips 104; and MacInnis, 8. There were 8 ballots rejected.
