SHORTCAKE

Combine 2 cups Robin Hood Easy-Bisk, 2 tablespoons sugar and 1/2 cup thin cream in the same manner as for Tea Biscuits—see side panel. Cut as individual shortcakes, or divide in two parts, rolling each to fit an 8-inch round pan. Place first half in pan, spread with soft butter and cover with second half.
