MONTREAL

MONTREAL (CP)—Prices were generally mixed at the close of moderate trading on the Montreal and Canadian stock exchanges Thursday. General Motors improved 1/4.

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TORONTO

TORONTO (CP)—Golds were the only bright feature of the stock market Thursday amid light trading. Golds advanced more than one point as almost every issue moved forward. Base metals were the big losers, despite gains by uranium. Their index was off more than one-half. Western oils were only a few decimal points short of a half point loss.

Golds were ahead for the third straight day after going seven sessions without an advance. McIntyre was the leader adding 1/2 at 31. Kerr-Addison gained 3/4 to 17 1/2 and Dome 1/2 to 14 1/2. Hollinger was the major loser, down 1/2 at 23 1/2.

Uraniums were generally ahead following an announcement that the United Kingdom was going to buy \$105,000,000 in uranium from Eldorado Mining, the Canadian government's purchasing agency. Gunmar added 3/4 at 17. Consolidated Discovery, 1/2 at 14 1/2. Algoma, 1/4 at 17. However none of the uranium stocks are listed on the base metal index and senior mines generally were down. Noranda was the big loser and it was off only 3/4 at 43 1/2.

Home Oil B was ahead 1 1/2 to 20 1/2 but almost every other oil was down. Index changes: golds up 1.12 to 82.00; base metals off 57 to 159.75; western oils off 46 to 138.45.

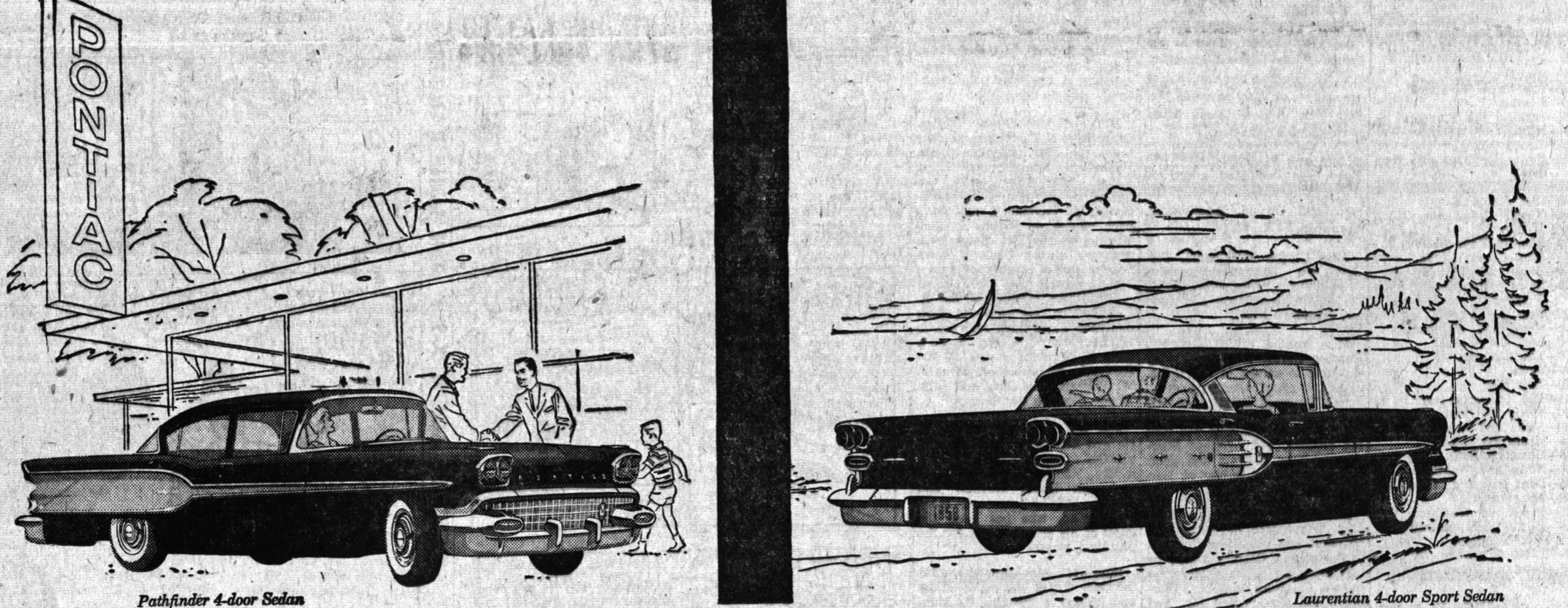
