Homer In 14th Inning Gives N. L. All Stars Win In Record-Breaking Game

Chicago, July 11 (AP)—Wil- lowry Red Schoendienst powered a Ted Gray home-run ball into the seats in upper left field in the 14th inning today to snap Ameri- can League all-star domination with a tinging 4-3 National League vic- tory.

Top-drawer pitching by New York's Larry Jansen and the lean Cincinnati whip, Ewell Blackwell, sent the crowd of 46,127 home babbling about one of the finest games in all-star history.

Saved by a back-to-the-wall catch by Chicago's Andy Pafko on Yankee Tom Henrich in the 12th, the National Leaguers clawed back for their first victory since 1944 in this first extra-inning "dream" game. The series now stands 12-5, still in favor of the Americans.

What was forecast as a routine decision for the 9-5 favored Amer- icans turned into a dog-eat-dog battle after Ralph Kiner tied the score with a lead-off homer off Detroit's Art Houtteman in the 11th.

With the Phils' brilliant relief-

er, Jim Konstanty, and Jansen and Blackwell in control, the Ameri- cans never threatened after they took the lead with two off Dodger Don Newcombe in the fifth. Never threatened, that is, except for the sensational catch by Pafko in the 12th.

Andy, second man in the National swing-shift centerfield gang, raced to the wall to drag down Henrich's long pinch drive with two gone in the 12th. Backing near the scoreboard, some 425 feet from home plate, Pafko made one of the finest catches in any all-star game.

Almost Won Game
Pafko almost won the game himself in the 11th when he sent left fielder Don DiMaggio of Boston back near the fence to the bases loaded and two out.

Jansen blazed into the record books with one of the best jobs since this colorful series originat- ed in 1933. Allowed to work more than three innings when the game

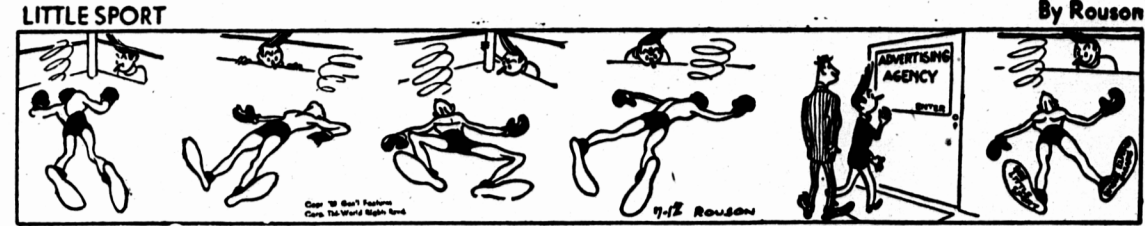
