There passed away at the Prince Edward Island Hospital in the early hours of Wednesday, March 30, 1966, Mr. Everett Stewart Jenkins, a highly respected resident of Cherry Valley. NEW YORK (AP)—New York City has borrowed \$241,755,000 to help meet the cost of municipal government, and agreed to pay its highest interest rate since the Depression. The city will pay the banks who bought its bonds a net interest rate of 4.24 per cent. This compared with the 3.1 per cent the city paid only a year ago. The single bid was made by a combine of the First National City and Chase Manhattan banks.
