

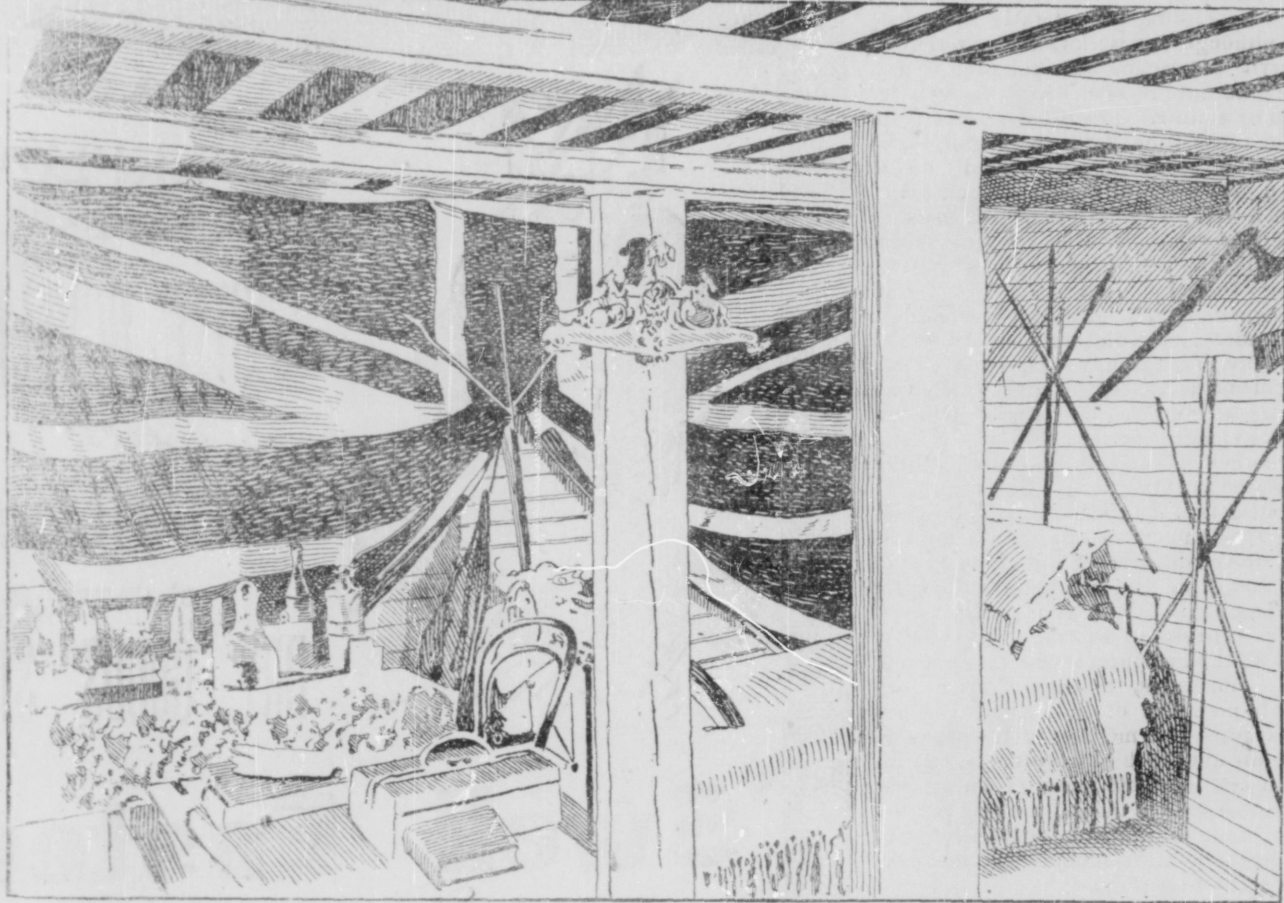

A BOER ADVOCATE.

Mr. Webster Davis, who resigned the position of assistant secretary of the Interior Department at Washington in order to be free to make speeches on behalf of the Boers, appears to have a pretty high opinion of himself, and will no doubt do his best to earn the big retainer which the Transvaal Government is said to have given him for advocating its cause in the United States. It will be remembered that Mr. Davis made a trip to Pretoria, and from there visited the Boer laagers at that time besieging Ladysmith. The expression of opinions concerning the war attributed to him in the press despatches led to the Washington authorities publishing the statement that his presence in South Africa was nowise official. He seems, however, to have impressed Mr. Kruger with his importance, and as a result he resigned his four thousand a year situation in Washington to become a representative at large of the Transvaal with the understanding that he is to pose as a disinterested lover of Boer humanity and freedom before the people of the United States. In telling a reporter of a Philadelphia paper how he had come to the determination to do this, he said: "Webster Davis," I said to myself at last, "in this one thing at least it shall not be said that you thought of your own interests first. I do not regret the step, nor do I believe I ever shall." A man who talks in that style may be safely allowed to go on talking, with little fear of him doing any good or any harm one way or another. The late lamented Artemus Ward could not have given a finer touch of humor to his public addresses than is contained in "Webster Davis. I said to myself."

ed from September to April the army will require more than £60,000,000 during the next twelve months, and this will not include sea transport from South Africa back to England. All estimates for ships, horses' forage and food supplies appear unduly heavy, and it is an open secret that the rates of the contractors have been abnormally high. Probably there has been no way out of it in the sudden emergency of the war, but there is a frank confession by military experts, in and out of Parliament, that the Government is paying too much for the sea transport of food stuffs, military stores and forage, and that the contractors are making immense fortunes out of the business of war. There are no scandals in the purchase of supplies, but the market is stripped and the traders dictate their own terms. This is the usual experience of every Government in the emergency of war, but John Bull is exceptionally sensitive to the reproach of paying more for a military campaign than justice and equity require.
