C.N.R. Announces Fast New Continental Train

MONTREAL, (CP) - Canadian National Railways today announced a new fast transcontinental schedule to Vancouver.

The new running times will apply to a new "Super Continental", a diesel-powered train that will go into operation April 24.

The CNR's Super Continental will leave Montreal daily at 3:25 p.m. EST.

The Canadian Pacific Railway announced Jan. 24 that beginning February 15 the transcontinental schedule will be reduced 16 hours on the Montreal-Vancouver run...

The CNR will make the 2,930-mile Montreal-Vancouver run in 72 1/2 hours and 20 minutes compared with the present 87 hours and 25 minutes.

Mortality Lower In Korean War MONTREAL, (CP) - The mortality rate for Canadian soldiers wounded in the Korean war was almost half that of the Second World War...

In an article in the current issue of the Canadian Medical Association journal, the corps and mortality in Korea was 34 for every 1,000 wounded.

The decrease was attributed to speedy evacuation, armored vests, more abundant and varied antibiotics and improvement in resuscitation and treatment.

Eddy Mills Modernize HULL, Que. (CP) - R. A. Irwin, president of the E. B. Eddy Company, told a meeting of employees Sunday night that the company plans \$5,000,000 worth of modernization improvements during the next two years.

International Nickel Declares Dividend

NEW YORK (CP) - The International Nickel Company of Canada Monday declared a dividend on common stock of 55 cents a share payable March 21 to shareholders of record Feb. 21.

This compares with dividends of 50 cents paid since the third quarter of 1951.

No Market For U. S. Beer Here OTTAWA, (CP) - Canada imports some whisky from the United States but no beer, simply because there is no Canadian market for a beaker of American beer.

They were commenting on a Washington dispatch quoting Representative John Dingell (Dem.-Mich.) as saying he will ask Congress to ban imports of Canadian beer.

Massey-Harris, Ferguson Shares Being Offered TORONTO (CP) - A new issue of \$25,000,000 Massey-Harris-Ferguson, Ltd. 4 1/2 per cent cumulative convertible preferred shares of \$100 par value is being offered by a large investment syndicate headed by Wood Gundy and Co., Ltd.

The shares will be convertible into common shares on the basis of 10 shares for each preferred share converted on or before March 1, 1959.

Proceeds will be used for general corporate purposes. It is contemplated that a substantial amount of the proceeds will be required for extension of the company's manufacturing facilities.

Provision is made in the new issue for a market retirement fund to be devoted to purchase in the market of preferred shares at a price not exceeding par.

November Payrolls Up Two Per Cent OTTAWA (CP) - Canadian workers earned a record \$10,855,000,000 in the first 11 months of 1954, an increase of two per cent over 1953, the bureau of statistics estimated today.

During November, labor earnings totaled \$1,028,000,000, down \$8,000,000 from October's total, but up \$32,000,000 from November, 1953, the bureau said.

Compared with the previous year, November payrolls were higher in all industrial groups except manufacturing. For the 11 months, earnings were higher in all groups except manufacturing and construction.
