OTTAWA NEWS. OTTAWA, July 26. The amount on deposit in the Post Office Savings Banks at the close of the last fiscal year was \$20,689,000, being an increase of a million dollars during the year.

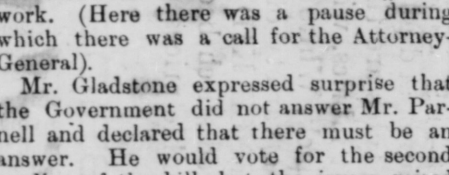
Our Fleet.
