PRESIDENT MCKINLEY ISSUES A PROCLAMATION.

To the American People to Offer a Thanksgiving.

WASHINGTON, July 7.—The War Department here has received the following despatch from General Shafter.

"I am just in receipt of a letter from General Stenton (probably Torat) agreeing to the exchange of Hobson and his men who are imprisoned here.

We are to make exchange in the morning. Yesterday he refused my proposition to exchange.

WASHINGTON, July 7.—The President has issued a proclamation to the American people asking the country to offer up a thanksgiving for the marvellous success of the American army and to pray for the speedy return of peace.

CAMARA ORDERED BACK.

Bishop Lawrence of Massachusetts tells a good story on himself and President Eliot of Harvard. When Phillips Brooks was elected bishop, President Eliot met Dr. Lawrence, who was then dean of the Episcopal Theological school at Cambridge and said to him: "The church has made the greatest mistake of a lifetime. Brooks was the pivot around which we revolved in Boston. Now you have spread him all over the state. Any one would have done for bishop."

Years after, when Phillips Brooks had gone to his reward and Dean Lawrence had been chosen in his place, he met President Eliot in the street again. The latter was warm in his congratulations. "My dear bishop," he said, "I must congratulate you. The church couldn't have made a better selection. I thought you should have been the choice when Brooks was chosen."

PUBLIC OPINION IN SPAIN

The Carlists and the Military Party

ARE ANXIOUS TO HAVE THE WAR CONTINUED.

The Conservatives Will Support the Present Government.

[SPECIAL TO THE EXAMINER.]

MADRID, July 7.—Senor Silvela, the Conservative leader, declares that the present situation is more favorable to peace than to war, but the Government alone can judge what ought to be done, under present circumstances, and he will support the Government in any determination it may reach.

The Republicans say the country is unable to withstand such misfortunes and that the time has come for a general settlement.

The military party favors the continuance of war and military men say they think Spain could never have expected a naval victory, and that so long as she does not meet with disaster ashore she ought not to sue for peace.

The Carlists are anxious for the war to continue.
