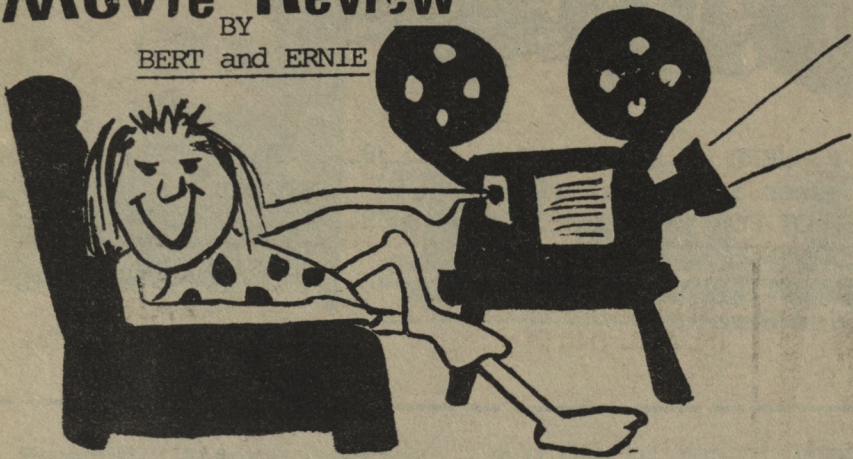


# Movie Review

# BOBBY BURNS DAY

January 25, 1759 was the day on which Robert Burns, Scotland's national poet, was born.
