On Friday evening, the 31 inst., the Schr. Adion, Wm. Farnaux, Master, on her way out of New London Harbour, grounded on the Bar, and a strong wind blowing from the Northwest, and a heavy sea running, she laboured heavily and made water very fast. About midnight floated over the Bar and out to sea. Being found to be in a sinking state, was put about for the land, and was run aground half a mile from the Southern entrance of the harbour. At 3 a.m., on Saturday, the cabin being full of water, all hands took to the rigging, where they remained till daylight, when, in response to a signal of distress, Mr. G. McKenzie manned a boat for their rescue, but was compelled to desist, after several fruitless attempts. At length a whaleboat was brought over the Sand Hills, and being manned by G. McKenzie, John McLeod (High's son), James Graham, Francis C. Homer, master of the American Schr. J. C. Homer, and his mate, the crew were taken off the wreck, at the risk of the lives of the salvors.
