War in The Transvaal

Particulars of the Struggle in South Africa.

Saved by His Water Bottle.
This is how Thomas W. Baker, of the 2nd Kings Royal Rifles, writes to his friends at Rye, Sussex: "We have done the Boers a lot of harm at Mooi river, Willow Grange, and Estcourt. We gave them a good thrashing yesterday, the 29th, and they fired over 200 shells. A piece hit my water-bottle and knocked it concertina shape. I was lucky: it saved my life, did the water-bottle. We are all in the best of health, and have fresh bread and meat every day. Our company took 1,000 head of cattle from the Boers and 475 head of sheep in two days, so they must be badly off for meat."

Shelled in a Hail Storm.
Ex-Sergeant Jones, of the Bideford Volunteers, who is now serving with the Durban Light Infantry, writes thus from Estcourt, under date 24th of November, to his aunt, Mrs. Hookway, of Bideford: "On Wednesday afternoon we went seven miles. We got wet through. Then it began to thunder and lighten, and then to hail. The hailstones were as large as marbles. We were shelled as we got there, but it was nearly dark and they had to stop. Were up a hill opposite the Boers all night. In the morning we went to another hill where there was a naval gun posted. They were doing good work and put one gun out of action and cleared the Boers off a lot of hills. But the Boers brought up a bigger gun than ours, and we could not touch them."

Joubert "Nearly Captured."
"We have been after the Boers again," says the same man on 30th November, writing from Frere this time. "They soon cleared. Our side lost about 20 killed and 30 or 40 wounded. The Boers had a lot more killed than we had. I saw about a dozen knocked over with one shell. We came here from Estcourt on Sunday and as we marched in at one end the Boers were clearing out at the other. And we nearly captured General Joubert. The Boers had blown up the bridge and looted all the houses, broken up everything in the houses. I found a few photos and cards lying about. I am sending a small one in the letter."

The Marines at Graspan.
From the letter of a Royal Marine of the Powerful to his parents at Rochdale: "We met and defeated the Boers at Belmont, after eight or nine hours fighting, on Thursday, 23rd November. We marched all Friday, rested till half-past two on Saturday morning, 25th November, when we started marching again, and encountered Boers at half-past eight a. m., in strong position on hills. Our Naval brigade of 230 marines and 40 bluejackets had to attack the Boers' main position on Graspan, under two cross fires. We suffered horribly, losing 112 killed and wounded and most of our officers. But we stuck to it, and carried it in a bayonet charge. General gave us great praise."

In Buller's Bodyguard.
The Natal Mounted Police have the honor of looking after General Buller's person; and W. L. Freemantle, a member of the corps, writes from Estcourt on 24th November, to his brother at Rushmore: "At the commencement of this week," he says, "three of the men and myself were sent on vedette duty up the Emmersdale Road. We left before daybreak, and went along very cautiously until we reached a kopje just above Emmersdale store, where we were watching the Boers looting the store. After a while they saw us and tried to cut us off from Estcourt, but we just managed to escape them. When they could not catch us

they amused themselves by firing shots after us, and did not hit anyone. They are the quickest people on the move I ever saw. The general can never find them in the same place twice together."

Boer's Bad Shooting
Again on 27th November, he writes from Frere: "All the mounted branches and a battery of artillery went out with the idea of getting into Colenso yesterday morning. The general, when we got within about three miles of Colenso, sent the N. M. P., out in front to see what the Boers' guns were like. They waited until we were nicely on the open veldt (the Boers were on a stone kopje) and then opened fire with all their guns. It was a very funny sensation hearing all the shells bursting so close. One dropped about 6 feet from me, but I am glad to say, did not explode. Some of their shrapnel landed unpleasantly near. They fired about 50 shells in all, and did not hit a single man or horse."

A private of the Irish Rifles, who fought at Stormberg, in a letter to his home, says that when General Gatacre saw the position the guide had led the troops into, he shot the guide dead with his own revolver.

Letters from Sterkstroom say that in the battle of Stormberg, when Gen. Gatacre was defeated, the British Artillery fired on the British Infantry by mistake. Gen. Gatacre's distress of mind, the letters say, was pitiful to see.
