MONTREAL (CP) - The stock market gained strength in active trading Monday.

Canada Cement advanced nine points at 130 and General Dynamics 64 1/2 was 4 1/2 better. International Paper and Noranda were each up one point at 78 and 73, respectively.

Aluminium lost 1 1/2 at 66 and Bank of Nova Scotia at 47 was 3/4 easier.

Banks drifted into softer territory while carriers generally held firm. A narrowly mixed tone ruled the utility section. The remainder of the industrial market leaned forward.

Mines moved upward irregularly in quiet trading. Hollinger gained 1 1/2 at 19. Preston was 35 cents higher at \$4.25 and Algoma at \$8.00 was 25 cents stronger. Western oils showed little change.

## Results Of Railway Strike Vote Now Being Counted; Results Known Aug. 11

MONTREAL (CP) - The results of a strike vote by railway employees were being counted Monday night by union officials from coast to coast.

Some 133,000 non-operating employees - those who do not actually run the trains - were eligible to vote, and Monday was the final day in which they could ballot.

Frank Hall, head of the negotiating committee of 14 unions involved in the dispute, said the voting was on a local basis and the central office here will not officially know the result until Aug. 11. Earlier, he said that reports indicated a "heavy" vote throughout the country.

If the employees vote in favor of a strike, a walkout could be called at any time after the result is announced but further negotiations would not be precluded.

## SEEK FRINGE BENEFITS

The unions made no wage requests in the dispute but demanded "fringe" benefits which the railroads said would cost \$80,000,000 a year.

Both Canadian Pacific and Canadian National Railways declared they could not grant the demands because of declining revenues.

Prime Minister St. Laurent said last Wednesday Parliament may be called in August if the men vote to strike, but "I hope it won't be necessary to call an emergency session."

## Plan New Power Project In B. C.

TRAIL, B. C. (CP) - Lands Minister R. E. Sommers of British Columbia announced Monday that a conditional water licence will be issued at once to Northwest Power Industries Limited for a gigantic power development in the Atlin lake region of northern British Columbia.

Northwest Power is a subsidiary of Quebec Metallurgical Industries and Frohisher Ltd., which in turn are subsidiaries of Ventures Ltd., holding company for a large number of Canadian mining firms.

The licence will enable Northwest Power to proceed with survey and other preliminary steps in the first stage of a \$270,000,000 development along the British Columbia-Yukon border.

The first phase of the vast project will be the construction of an 880,000 horsepower hydro-electric and smelting project, 800 miles north of Vancouver.

"An evidence of their preparedness and good faith, Northwest Power will post a performance bond of \$2,500,000," Mr. Sommers said.

"The company will receive no special tax concessions and they will be required to clear areas to be flooded and to pay full rates for the water they use."

Mr. Sommers said there will be a diversification of industries, including an aluminum smelter as part of the operations. Reynolds Aluminum Company have signed for 30 per cent of the hydro-electric power.

"The region will not be dependent for a single commodity," he said. "Plans call for the products of nickel, cobalt, iron and steel, ferromanganese, silicomanganese, and zinc concentrates. There exist great possibilities for utilizing the low-cost power that will result in the manufacture of lumber and pulp and paper."

## Dr. Valdmanis Trial Begins At St. John's

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld. (CP) - Three representatives of the German machine company he is accused of defrauding appeared Monday as prosecution witnesses against Dr. Alfred A. Valdmanis at the long-delayed opening of his preliminary hearing.

The crown thus launched its case against the 47-year-old Latvian-born economic expert more than three months after he was arrested in St. Andrews, N.B., and charged with defrauding the Newfoundland government and the German firm of \$420,000. He allegedly engineered the swindle while serving as chief of provincial economic development.

The preliminary hearing is being held privately because Newfoundland courts apply the law that permits magistrates in most parts of the Commonwealth to hear the press from such initial proceedings.

## WITNESS NAMED

The only witness Monday to be fully identified was Herbert Marx, director of Miag Vertriebsgesellschaft, the company Valdmanis is accused of defrauding.

Valdmanis was driven to the courthouse accompanied by two policemen who picked him up at the Cochrane Hotel where he has been held in custody since mid-May.

The Latvian resigned from the economic development post Feb. 10. He permits magistrates in most parts of the Commonwealth to hear the press from such initial proceedings.

Valdmanis has been free only once since his arrest in February. Three short days of freedom ended May 17 when his bail bond was cancelled and he was re-arrested on a warrant designed to prevent him from leaving Newfoundland or disposing of property.
