Ed. Hargreaves Kirkland Expecting To Encounter Bidgood Ore On 500-Ft.

PRODUCE

(Canadian Press) MONTREAL, July 12—Steady advance of butter prices featured Montreal's open produce markets last week. Cheese and eggs were about even while potatoes declined.

Butter ended the week at 23-1-4 cents per pound for carlots or less of no 1 while lots to retailers were 24 for solids and 24-1-2 for cream. Cheese averaged 13 to 13-1-2 cents for Ontario white, 13-1-4 to 3-4 for colored, 12-1-2 to 13 for Quebec white and 13 to 13-1-4 for colored.

(Canadian Press) WINNIPEG, July 11—Wheat futures prices fell 4 to 4-1-2 cents Saturday on Winnipeg grain exchange July closing at 81, October and December 90 1-4 to 3-8.

Forecast for showers in Western Canada and the possibility of week-end rain over a large area of United States induced selling on a market that found only thin, scattered support. Export business was confined to a few small lots, no selling was attributed to the wheat board.

Chicago led the decline in North American markets, with prices at the lowest point down the five-cent limit. Losses at Winnipeg were more than four cents at bottom, while Minneapolis recorded similar losses. The coarse grain cash markets found dealings small, with some trade reported in oats and six row barley. Pit trade in coarse grains was less active than Friday. Profit-taking appearing in nearly all commodities. Exporters and southern houses were credited with barley purchases. Spreading operations were noticed in which rye was bought against sales in the wheat pit.

Stocks At Highest Level Since Recovery New York Curb

(By Frank MacMillan) (Associated Press Financial Writer) (A.P. By Guardian's Special Wire) NEW YORK, July 12—Further impressive stock market buying lifted prices Saturday generally to the highest level thus far witnessed in the recovery movement. The Associated Press average of 60 stocks was up .4 of a point at 65.2 the highest mark for this index since July 21, 1931. Transfers totaled 897,180 shares. With advances ranging from fractions to two or more points throughout the two-hour session, trading attention was centered principally on the rails, industrial specialties and selected utilities. Interest in individual stocks was intensified by the revival of rumors that a number of corporations will boost their dividends soon on the basis of greater earnings and the disinclination to pay the government large taxes on undistributed net income. Outstanding among stock gainers were Westinghouse, Northern Pacific, Alwar and Hudson, Atlantic Coast Line, N. Y. Central, Spiegelmayer-Stern, Douglas Aircraft, Coca-Cola, Western Union, American Sugar Refining, Consolidated Edison and U. S. Steel. A shade up or down were American Telephone, General Motors, Chrysler, Anaconda, International Nickel and Chesapeake and Ohio. J. I. Case, Deere and International Harvester dropped as much as a point. Besides Hiram Walker and International Nickel, price changes in the Canadian list were for the most part narrow. Dome Mines previous close of 169. Among papers, Bathurst Paper and St. Lawrence Paper preferred firmed slightly. Sales 12,639 shares; bonds \$102,250.

Selected Issues Press Forward

(C.P. By Guardian's Special Wire) MONTREAL, July 12—A group of selected issues pressed quietly forward in Saturday's stock market but others found the going tough most of the time. Upward leanings were exhibited by rail equipments, banks and papers while metals, constructions and utilities took the lower road for fractional losses. Liquors were mixed. Considerable interest was aroused when a single sale of 2,000 shares of Montreal Power debentures was marked up at the previous closing place of 50 5-8. Power common advanced 1-8 to 30 7-8 but Brazilian and Shawinigan were down that much each. Rail equipments again found good demand and Canada Car preferred gained 1-2 at 18 1-2, highest in more than two years. National Steel Car firmed 3-4 and Canada Car common and C. P. R. remained unchanged. Selling hit the metals from the start. Nickel lost only 1-4 at 50 1-4 but Noranda dropped more than a point to 87 1-2. Hollinger declined narrowly and Smelters held even. Sudden buying boosted Steel of Canada 1 1-2 points to 65 1-2 while the common climbed fractionally. Losses of 1-2 each were posted for Foundation Company and Gypsum Lime. Banks were livelier than usual and gains of a point each were registered by Canada at 88 and Montreal at 191. Canadienne eased 3-8 while Royal held even at the
