LOCAL AND OTHER ITEMS.

NOTES OF THE MARKETS.—Wheat advanced a cent in Chicago on Saturday. The whole market was firmer.

Creamery butter is very dull at 18 to 18½c in Montreal, cheese at 9 to 9½c, with nothing doing.

Several Ontario millers advanced flour 15c. on Friday. One Manitoba miller quoted 5c. advance in the morning and 10c. more in the afternoon.

In Charlottetown, the buyers are paying 24c. for potatoes, 26c. for oats, 12½c. for eggs, and from 4 to 5½c. for dressed pork.

STRUCK IT RICH.—It is said that some Monctonians who have been interested in mining for a number of years, think they have struck a rich thing in placer mining on the Meander River in Hants County, Nova Scotia. The property is about fourteen miles from Windsor, and the gravel is said to be very rich. The find has created considerable stir in mining circles, and areas have been taken up for fifty miles around. Samples of the dirt are said to have yielded as high as \$100 a ton.

CITY SCHOOL BOARD.—The regular monthly meeting of the City School Board was held last evening. According to the teachers reports the enrollment during the month was 1431—816 boys and 615 girls. The percentage of attendance was 89, as follows: Prince street 92; Queen Square 88; West Kent 88. The Board, observing that the number of absentees and the cases of truancy and tardiness have increased during the month, decided, unless an improvement be at once effected, to put in operation the compulsory clause, and the regulation of the Board pertaining to such cases. The secretary was asked to have the teachers report the number of requests from parents for scholars to leave school before the hour of closing.

CONCERNING CHEESE AND BUTTER

While travelling around among the factories, I am surprised to find how many of the patrons of cheese and butter factories thoughtlessly allow their cows free access to the turnips and turnip tops and still they will look for and expect top market prices for their products. Now, we all know, or should know by this time, that if we persist in thus carelessly allowing the cows to roam at will and gorge themselves with turnip tops that we are doing an injury, not only to ourselves but to all in connection with the factory we send to, as one can of turnip milk will impart the flavor to the whole vat. It is a very difficult matter for the operator, owing to the chilled condition of the milk at this season of the year, to detect objectionable flavors until in the vat and heated up when of course it is too late. To carry on dairying successfully you must have the co-operation of the individual patron not only for quantity but quality as well. There are quite a number of butter plants going in on the Island this fall and the only way we can expect to successfully cope with the keen competition in the dairy world at the present time is for each and every patron to put his shoulder to the wheel.
