NEWSPAPERS AND PERIODICALS.

A still further proof of the rapid growth of the country is to be seen in the distribution of newspapers and periodicals, of which there were posted from the office of publication during the eleven months ended 31st May, 1882, no less than 4,885,000 pounds weight.

POSTAL REVENUE.

The postal revenue for the year is given in the above table. Compared with the previous year it shows an increase of 2 1/2 per cent. The total expenditure for the year was \$2,459,356, an increase of \$126,957, or about 5 1/2 per cent.

REGISTERED LETTERS.

The estimated number of registered letters passing by the post in the Dominion for 1882 is 2,450,000. Of this number 113 were stated to have miscarried from various causes.

DEAD LETTERS.

The number of ordinary dead letters, circulars, post cards, &c., received at the Dead Letter Office during the year was 568,310.

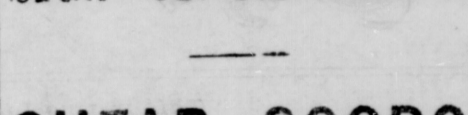
