From a war-time baby effort to a full scale established peacetime project is the story in brief of the Prince Edward Island Plowing Match and Agricultural Fair at Dundas to be held Wednesday and Thursday.

It was in the somewhat sombre days of 1941 that a group of enthusiastic residents from Kings County gave birth to this annual get-together featuring plowing competitions. The prize list then totalled a modest two hundred dollars. Today it totals over five thousand dollars.

The remarkable success achieved by this organization speaks highly of the efforts of those in charge and the magnificent support from the people not only in Kings County, but throughout the Province.

The program this year promises to provide lively competition and keen interest. Besides plowing there will be the livestock exhibits including horses, cattle, swine, sheep and poultry. There will also be competitions in roots and vegetables and a Handicraft, Domestic, and Household Economics Division.

The continued growing interest in the Dundas Fair is a source of great satisfaction and pride to the President of the organization, Mr. Leslie Hunter and his associates.

In addition to the agricultural exhibits and plowing competitions there is entertainment for both old and young and refreshments booths. There too, one will find on display the latest in farm implements and machinery.

The innovation this year of electric power will add to the festivities and program in the evenings.

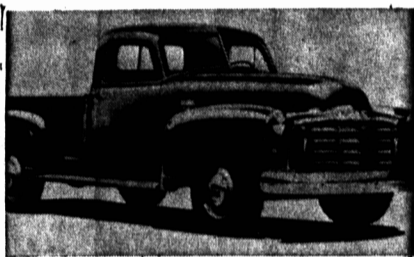
