H'Ways Minister Is Queried

Dr. L. G. Dewar yesterday asked Highways Minister MacKay whether he was aware that between 50-75 per cent of the roads in Prince County are still blocked.
Mr. MacKay said he could hardly credit the statement as he understood that road clearing was proceeding normally. However, he said he would take the matter up and see what could be done to remedy the situation.
R. R. Bell, Q. C., asked Mr. MacKay what could be done to relieve the condition at Rusticoville Bridge, which he said was practically impassible.
Mr. MacKay said he will bring the matter to the attention of the engineer in that area. The Minister noted that many places on the road are bad at this time of year. Mr. Bell thought an hour or two of work would remedy the situation.
