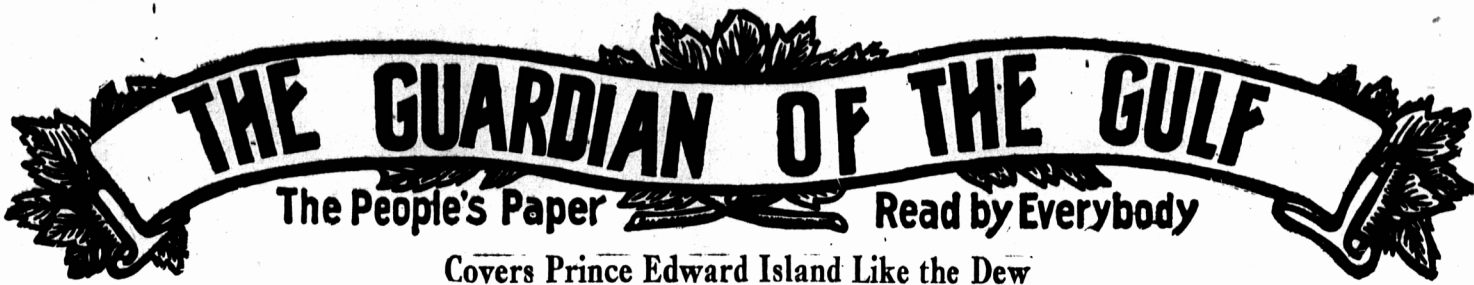

### Reject Communist Move To Restrict Red Cross

#### Would Keep Mercy Teams Out Of All Prison Camps

MUNSAN, Korea, (AP) — The United Nations command Sunday flatly rejected a Communist proposal that Red Cross activity be restricted in the exchange of more than 87,000 war prisoners starting Wednesday.

However, Col. L. D. Buttolph, acting as senior member of the UN repatriation commission, sharply reminded the Reds that the armistice agreement called for Red Cross teams to visit all prison camps to comfort the prisoners and distribute gift articles.

### 18 Million Are Barred From Free Food

BERLIN (AP) — East German troops and police crushed hunger riots in the Soviet zone Sunday night and barred 18,000,000 needy from free American food in West Berlin.

### 899 Candidates

Last week also saw 902 candidates entered on nomination day Monday, but by week's end the number was cut to 899. In Quebec's Terrebonne constituency, Progressive Conservative candidate Philippe Beauchamp withdrew, leaving the seat by acclamation to Lionel Bertrand, Liberal. And in Quebec's Argenouil-Deux Montagnes, G. Ovide Gagnon, independent Progressive Conservative, also withdrew.

### Voting Starts

For some Canadians, voting starts today, a week before Aug. 10. These are members of the armed services—an estimated 105,000 in Canada and abroad—who are eligible to vote from Aug. 3 to Aug. 8 for candidates in their home constituencies. Their ballots will be counted Aug. 17.
