Anti-Dumping Laws Aimed At U.S. Goods

LONDON (CP) — Lionel Chevrier, Canada's high commissioner to Britain, told a group of U.S. businessmen that features of the Canadian anti-dumping laws which have brought complaints from British exporters really were aimed at low-priced U.S. products.

"The automatic feature of Canadian anti-dumping laws, which is of some concern to British manufacturers, was established, designed and continues in being to prevent the possibility of massive dumping of U.S.-manufactured goods on the Canadian market at prices below those prevailing in the U.S.," Chevrier said in a speech before the American Chamber of Commerce.

The high commissioner touched on this point as he took the unusual course of delivering a luncheon lecture on Canada-U.S. relations in this British capital.

British exporters have complained that the Canadian anti-dumping laws have tended to curtail the Canadian market for British goods at a time when Britain is waging a battle against a heavy international trade deficit.

low-priced goods from the U.S. Canada's national interest includes the need of close cooperation with the U.S., Chevrier added, "but let there be no delusion that in the years ahead our respective national interests will always coincide with the North American interest in the broadest sense of that term."

Canada wanted to see the extent of U.S. control over Canadian interest "arrested, if not reversed." This was an issue that required "very delicate handling" because Canada did not want to see an adverse impact on the flow of American capital "which continue to be required."

BRITONS NOT SATISFIED
The Canadian government has promised to give consideration to Britain's arguments as part of the Kennedy round of world tariff bargaining. British manufacturers maintain this is not good enough, since there are indications the Kennedy round may take some years to bear fruit.

Chevrier's explanation seemed to suggest Canada could not undertake changes without encouraging massive imports of

Rembrandt Drawing Is Stolen

MONTREAL (CP) — A Rembrandt drawing, The Death of Jacob, was stolen during visiting hours from the Montreal Museum of Fine Arts.

Museum Director David Carter refused to give an estimate of the drawing's value.

He said the theft occurred in front of about a score of people in the second-floor room where 17th century masters are on display.

Police said a woman told them a man about 30, six feet tall and 200 pounds, left with the drawing about 2:15 p.m.

The drawing, 14 1/2 inches by 10 inches, had been fastened to the wall by screws.

A mixture of drawing and sepia wash, it depicts Jacob dying surrounded by relatives and retainers.

It was acquired by the museum in 1909 as a bequest from an estate.

The Old Testament scene was hanging between two other Rembrandt works, Landscape and Portrait of a Woman. They were not touched.

TO GO TO ABBEY
VATICAN CITY (Reuters) — Pope Paul is expected to go to the ancient Benedictine Abbey of Monte Cassino Saturday to consecrate its rebuilt church, a Vatican spokesman said Wednesday. The abbey, on a 1,600-foot hillside between Rome and Naples, was destroyed by allied bombs during the Second World War.

Conservative Aims Barbs At Levesque

MONTREAL (CP) — A high-ranking officer of the Conservative party has accused Quebec's resources minister, Rene Levesque, of encouraging "sensationalism and violence" by his words and actions.

Egan Chambers, a member of the national executive of the Progressive Conservative Association, criticized Mr. Levesque for making derisive remarks about the wealthy Montreal suburb of Westmount and Hampstead in a recent speech.

"How long must we wait after that speech before bombs are thrown again in Westmount and Hampstead?" Mr. Chambers, former Tory member of Parliament for Montreal - St. Lawrence - St. George, asked students at Sir George Williams University.

The former Conservative Association president also accused the Quebec cabinet minister of showing "an attitude of disloyalty" to the Queen during her visit to Quebec City.

MALAYSIA NABS INVADERS
KUALA LUMPUR (Reuters) — The Malaysian government Thursday claimed further successes against Indonesian invaders in south Malaya. An official statement said three were killed and 16 captured in the Pontian and Labis areas in "the last few days."

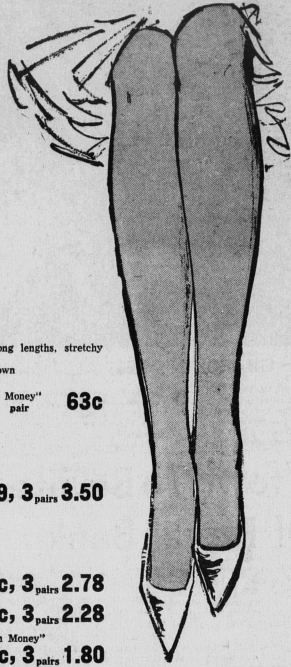
