

Anti-Christian Elements Seen Serious Threat

TORONTO (CP) — Aggressive anti-Christian elements in the cities often win converts from the churches, the 26th annual meeting of the Toronto Conference of the United Church of Canada was told here.

Rev. A. E. MacKenzie, co-superintendent in Toronto for the church's home missions committee, said that "planting the cross of Christ in a city apartment is an incredibly difficult task."

The mass movement of people from rural areas has aggravated the problem, he said. Gambling organizations and liquor outlets are often smarter and more aggressive than churches in the battle for the city dweller's leisure hours.

Mr. MacKenzie said ministers also find it more difficult to talk religion to a man who receives an inadequate wage and has the fear of unemployment hanging over him.

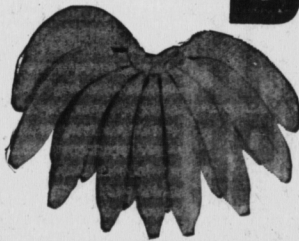
