

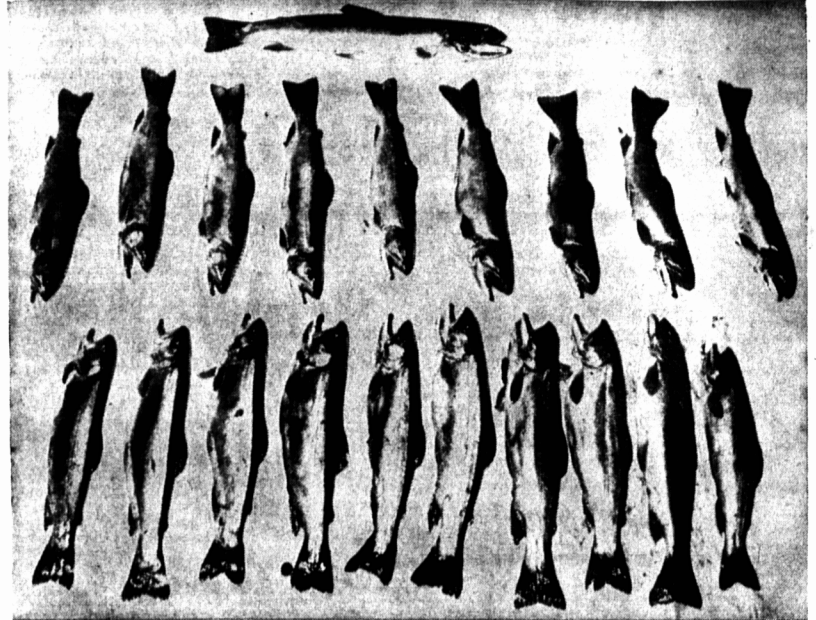


SANDRA STEWART MARILYN NORRIS PHYLLIS NICHOLSON ETHEL KERR

Lord's Day Act Case Adjourned

TORONTO (CP)—The hearing of Lord's Day Act charges against the three Toronto daily newspapers, the CBC and radio station CKEY was adjourned Wednesday by Magistrate T. S. Elmore until May 22.

All five have been charged with violating the act by disseminating or gathering news on Sunday.

C. F. H. Carson, special prosecutor for the attorney general's department, asked for the adjournment pending the result of an application by the CBC to the Ontario Supreme Court.

The CBC has asked that the prosecution against it be quashed, claiming that as an agency of the Crown it is not subject to the Lord's Day Act.
