Anglican Archdeacon Recalls 'Reincarnation' in Yukon

DAWSON CITY, Y.T. (CP) - There are strange things done under the midnight sun and one of the strangest is the reported reincarnation of a northern Indian that spanned a religious revival in the Yukon.

This was one of numerous incidents of the historic kind recalled by the venerable Archdeacon C. Swanson during a visit to this exciting spot on the Yukon 12 years after he was ordained as an Anglican minister in 1913.

He will take part in the dedication service of the restored Palace Grand Theatre, which will hold the first Dawson City gold rush festival.

Archdeacon Swanson, London-born and a graduate of the University of Toronto, arrived in the Yukon 12 years after the hectic rush by 100,000 along the trail of '86.

Dawson City had already started its decline from a bustling, gambling and hard-drinking centre of 35,000. Fewer than 1,500 populated this centre, 1,300 air miles northwest of Edmonton. Of its seven houses were empty and already several of the historic haunts had been destroyed by fire.

Archdeacon Swanson was rector of parishes at Little Salmon and Carmacks, about 200 miles from Dawson City.
