Local and Other Items.

CANADIAN EGGS.—It is said that Canadian eggs, in 30 dozen boxes, in compartments, are popular in London.

A BIG OYSTER.—An oyster, 12 inches long, 7 inches wide and weighing a pound and a half has been found by Mr J W Hughes, of Wellington Ward Market, in a barrel of oysters imported by him from Malpeque Bay, P. E. I.—Ottawa Journal.

A PLUM.—The Portland, Oregon, Telegram says: "Governor Lord yesterday appointed Captain Andrew Hoben warden of the Port of Portland. Captain Hoben was strongly recommended to the place by many of the heavy shippers and best firms of Portland, and secured the plum unsolicited, in the face of strong opposition. The appointment is for the district of the Columbia, which also includes Astoria.
