Canada Has No Solution To Polish Treasures Problem

OTTAWA (CP) - Poland has been informed "that the Canadian government has no solution to the problem of the Polish treasures." External Affairs Minister Smith announced Monday.

Asked in the Commons' external affairs committee by Opposition leader Pearson whether progress had been made in settling the problem, Mr. Smith replied that "at the moment we are taking the position of the former (Liberal) government that this is a matter between the Bank of Montreal and the depositaries."

The treasures in question, comprising the bulk of Poland's artistic and literary treasures, were sent to Canada during the Second World War. Part are in the provincial museum at Ottawa, the most important being in the custody of the Bank of Montreal in Ottawa.

Of two custodians who were named since Canada was named admission to the vaults, the bank holding the treasures is only a joint - custodian and must present himself in Canada with another holding in Ottawa. The custodian in Ottawa adheres to the government-in-exile in London.

LEGAL AVEUE OPEN

Canada Has No Solution To Polish Treasures Problem

OTTAWA (CP) - Poland has been informed "that the Canadian government has no solution to the problem of the Polish treasures." External Affairs Minister Smith announced Monday.

Asked in the Commons' external affairs committee by Opposition leader Pearson whether progress had been made in settling the problem, Mr. Smith replied that "at the moment we are taking the position of the former (Liberal) government that this is a matter between the Bank of Montreal and the depositaries."

The treasures in question, comprising the bulk of Poland's artistic and literary treasures, were sent to Canada during the Second World War. Part are in the provincial museum at Ottawa, the most important being in the custody of the Bank of Montreal in Ottawa.

Of two custodians who were named since Canada was named admission to the vaults, the bank holding the treasures is only a joint - custodian and must present himself in Canada with another holding in Ottawa. The custodian in Ottawa adheres to the government-in-exile in London.

LEGAL AVEUE OPEN

Mr. Smith said the government has recourse to legal action "since it is not clear that the statute of limitations is against the depositaries."

"What happens when they die?" asked Jean (L.-Ottawa East).

"You could have a government of successors," Mr. Smith answered.

Nicholas Mandelkow (P.-Quebec) said the problem was simple. The treasures belong to the Polish people, and Canada recognizes the present government of Poland as being the government.

"Yes," sighed Mr. Smith, "the Canadian government has got custody of the treasures."

VERDUN, France (Reuters) - United States Army court martial sentenced 10 years for a soldier in wartime desertion. Powers was reduced to six months hard labor.

Powers spent 14 years in the house of his French friend, Miss Yvette Brette, the village of Mont Verdun, northern France. He fathered children.

A U.S. Army court martial sentenced him here Friday for ten years. An army spokesman announced the reduction of the sentence.
