Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island, New Brunswick: Clear with a few cloudy intervals; fog patches along the coast; little change in temperature; light winds: Low - high at Halifax 58 and 75, Yarmouth 55 and 70, Gosport and New Glasgow 57 and 85, Sydney and Campbellton 85 and 85, Kentville, Charlottetown and Moncton 60 and 85, Fredericton 63 and 85, Saint John 57 and 75, Edmundston 57 and 85.

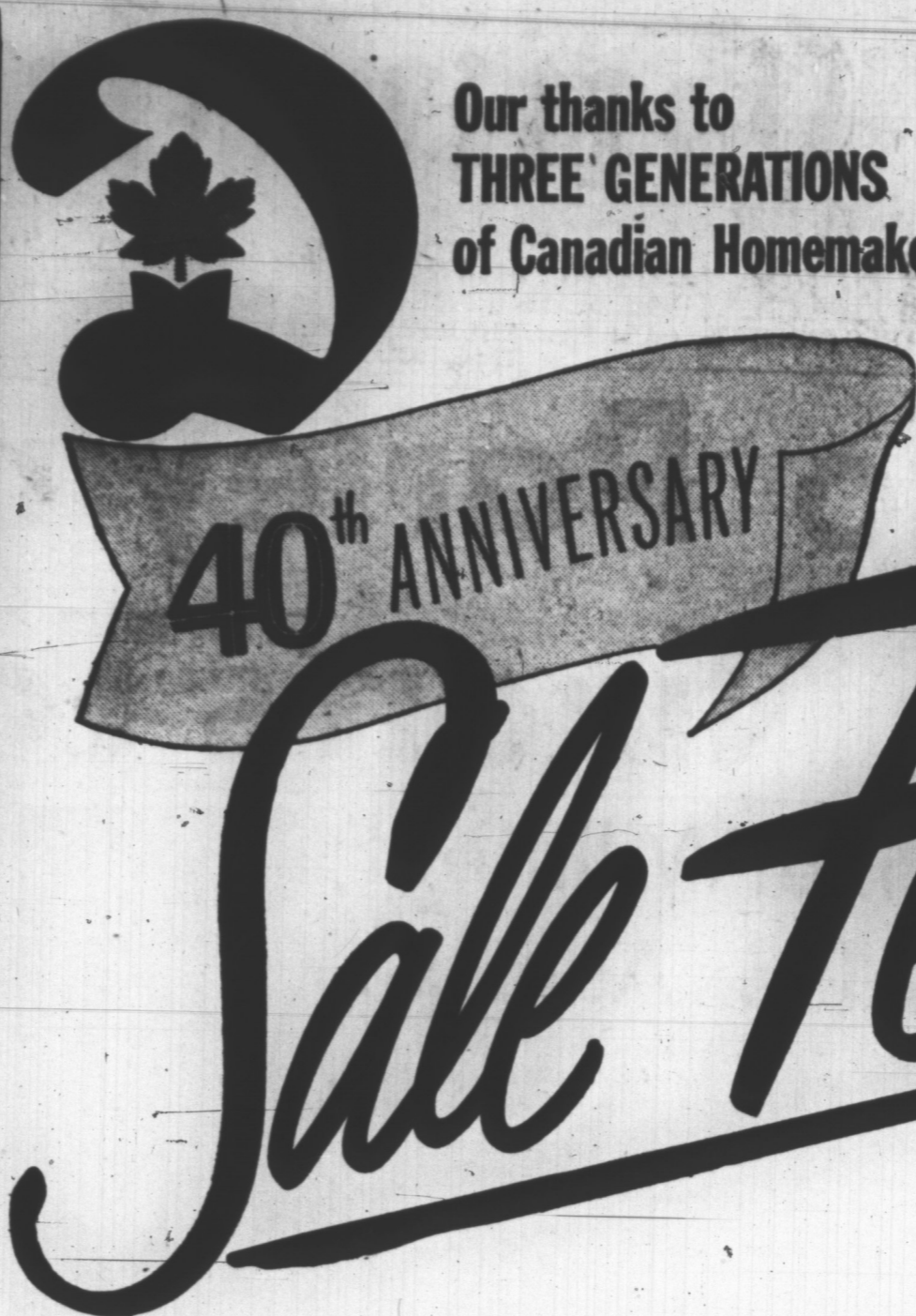
