

Meteoric Shower in Alabama.

RESIDENTS OF ROMER FRIGHTENED BY THE FALL OF CELESTIAL BODIES.

A few nights ago, says a recent despatch from Montgomery, Ala., the family of Captain Oscar Hepthy were awakened about 10 o'clock by the noise of a tremendous explosion, which appeared to be over their house, situated about half a mile from the town of Romer, on the Montgomery road. The startled inmates rushed to the windows, but were able only to distinguish two glowing masses, one about 150 feet to the right of the house, and the other back of it, but nearly twice that distance.

The captain's second son, Moses Hepthy, who had been to town and had just reached his father's gate when the explosion took place, says that the meteor came with fearful speed from the north-east, and, while only a few yards from the earth, all at once exploded in three portions, one of which—the smallest, as well as he could judge—fell into Parker's Pool, a small but very deep sheet of water, about an eighth of a mile from the Hepthy homestead.

The two fragments which struck close to the house were white hot when first inspected, and are still so warm as to render it impossible to touch them with the naked hand. One falling struck an apple tree, which it entirely consumed. Both were small, the larger about a third greater than the other, and measuring only 16 feet two inches around. They are imbedded nearly three feet in the ground, which has been dried up and seamed with cracks from the intense heat of the meteorites.

Professor Middleton, of Montgomery, has examined them, and has purchased them of the Hepthys. He says they consist principally of meteoric iron, but exhibit traces of what he thinks must be granite fused into a vitreous state by the extraordinary heat. However, it is impossible to be positive until the stones cool sufficiently to be handled. If they contain granite, though, as supposed, they are invaluable because unique so far.

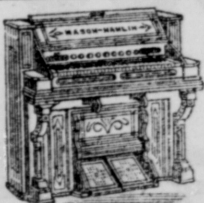

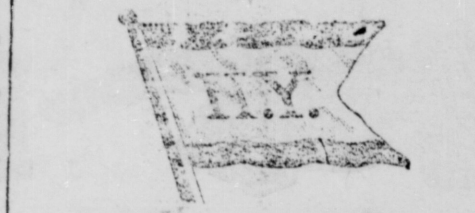

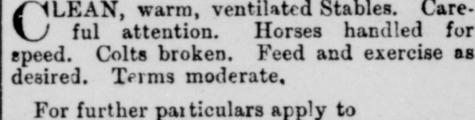
