Truman Calls For Speed-up In Atomic Program

Expansion Of U. S. Fighting Forces Is Ordered By Truman

WASHINGTON, July 7—(AP)—President Truman today ordered an expansion of the United States fighting forces through enlistment or the draft in order to throw greater strength into the Korean struggle.

ARREST KING'S BROTHER-IN-LAW

BRUSSELS, Belgium, July 7—(Reuters)—Walter Baels, 40-year-old brother-in-law of exiled King Leopold, was arrested early today at the Franco-Belgian border to serve a three-year sentence imposed in 1946 for desertion from the army. Baels, a brother of Leopold's commoner wife, Princess De Rethy, had been sentenced in absentia.
