Month Of September Is Darkest On Record

Last month was the darkest September on record here, it was learned yesterday from Warren A. Burns, official weather observer at the Experimental Farm.

The 118.2 hours of September sunshine compares with the 120 hours recorded in 1933, which held the record up to now. The brightest September on record was in 1917, when there were 245.8 hours of sunshine. The average sunshine is 178.9 hours.

The mean temperature of 55.7 degrees compares with the average of 58.1, but is slightly above the record low for the month, which was the average of 54.1 in 1912. The lowest temperature recorded last month was 34, which is a bit warmer than the 32 degrees on September 29, 1947.

The warmest September day on record was the eighth of the month in 1945, with an 88 degree reading, and the warmest September was in 1934, with an average of 62.7 degrees.

The total rainfall last month of 4.78 inches was far below the all-time record of 12.40 inches in September, 1942, which also produced the heaviest rainfall for one day of 8.46 inches.

The driest September on record was in 1930, with only 1.05 inches of rain. Mr. Burns stated.

Total rainfall to date this year of 36.53 compares with the average of 29.75.

Welfare Meet Is Underway

The second annual meeting of ministers and deputy ministers of welfare from the Atlantic provinces opened a one-day stand in St. John's, Nfld., yesterday to talk over mutual problems.

Topics include education and training of field staff, unemployment assistance, elimination of categorical allowances and their incorporation in a general assistance program, interprovincial institutions and residence requirements for persons getting social assistance.

Attending are welfare ministers W.S. Kennedy Jones of New Brunswick, H.W. Wedge of Prince Edward Island and a number of provincial officials and their deputies.

New Scholarship Formed To Honor French Reporter

OXFORD, Miss. (AP) — The University of Mississippi's daily newspaper, the Mississippiian, has established a scholarship in honor of French reporter Paul Guillard, killed in campus rioting Sunday night.

The scholarship will be known as the Paul Guillard Memorial Scholarship, with all money going into the fund to be collected from Ole Miss students. Up to \$1,000 will be granted to each journalism student selected to receive money from the scholarship fund.

The newspaper has also benefited from a second fund for the benefit of any French student studying in the United States.

This scholarship also will be in Guillard's honor, funds to be collected from off-campus sources.

Guillard was reporting for Agence France-Presse and the London Daily Sketch.

Tribute Paid To 2 Judges

OTTAWA (CP) — Tribute was paid in the Supreme Court of Canada Tuesday by the bench to the legal profession and former members of the court.

The brief ceremony commemorated the 75th birthday of chief justice Thibaudau Rinfret and Hon. Charles Holland Locke, who reached retirement age of 75 on Sept. 18, took place at the opening of the court's fall session.

Following the ceremony, the court announced four minor judgments, clearing its backlog of cases for the first time in its history.

A total of 48 appeal cases will be heard at the fall session, in which the court will be presided over by the Atlantic provinces.

Chief Justice Patrick Kerwin said Canada suffered a great loss in the death of Mr. Rinfret in Montreal recently. He said one of Mr. Rinfret's last legal tasks was reading of the Civil Code of Quebec.

Chief Justice Kerwin said Mr. Justice Locke, now a member of an Ottawa law firm, exhibited a sound understanding of his duties as a judge during his term on the Supreme Court of Canada.
