MADRID, July 22.—Because of the departure of the royal family for San Sebastian, on the Basque coast, the Madrid troops are under arms, and the police are prepared to prevent any hostile demonstrations. It is expected that, despite the authorities' best endeavours, the Queen Regent will be hissed by the populace.

In various parts of the country Anarchists are being arrested by the score, a move which the Republican press considers only an artifice of the Government to secure the payment of taxes, through pretending that public safety is menaced by the Anarchists. The evils of the situation increase day by day. The Cabinet is in an altogether untenable position.

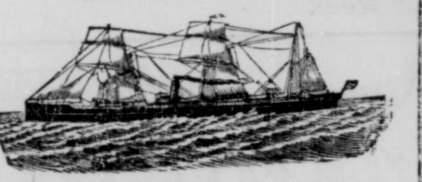
