HARVEST

With the grain harvest well underway we appear to be ending up on the average with about a half crop of grain and a 25 per cent crop of straw. Both deficiencies are important. The lack of hedging will be reflected in the production of other crops next year, as there will be less manure available for fertilizing. Most new seedlings are poor and a choice must be made between plowing them up or plowing up other hay land. In any event this year's drought will be like "the evil that men do lives after them" as the effects will persist for a long time.

ARDA REPORTS

In late spring and early summer considerable publicity was given to the fact that a firm of consultants (Acres) had been engaged to prepare a comprehensive development plan for the province. With this thought and purpose we are heartily in accord but are puzzled on the lack of publicity associated with the event.

Sometime ago a preliminary report was presented but up to this point it has been a highly privileged document. The next point is that there appears to be a minimum of conferring or consulting with Islanders who might have some ideas or opinions with respect to development.

Is it really necessary for this operation to proceed on what appears to be a basis of secrecy in relation to both the study and preliminary report. Initially a great deal of stress was placed on the involvement of people in the ARDA program. Has that concept been lost sight of in the present instance?

EXCITING

We would surmise that many people look upon farming as being a rather dull and uninteresting occupation. In some cases this may be so but on many farms the very opposite is the case.

For instance we had the opportunity of visiting a farm on Labour Day where the following operations were in progress.

- 1. Two combines working in the grain field. 2. A baler working in the straw. 3. A tractor working in the field. 4. Involvement in stock raising. 5. Probably some potato digging. For young people who like action and to see the results of their work modern progressive mechanized farming has a great deal to offer.

Contract Let At Botwood

OTTAWA (CP) - G. Gorman (Nova Scotia) Ltd. of Halifax has been awarded a \$717,117 contract for the construction of a wharf and storage shed at Botwood, a central Newfoundland shipping centre on the Bay of Exploits, 297 miles northwest of St. John's.

The contract calls for a steel tube wharf parallel to the shore, 250 feet long and 105 feet wide, and a 200-by-70-foot metal-clad shed.

The wharf is designed to handle vessels of up to 10,000 tons.
