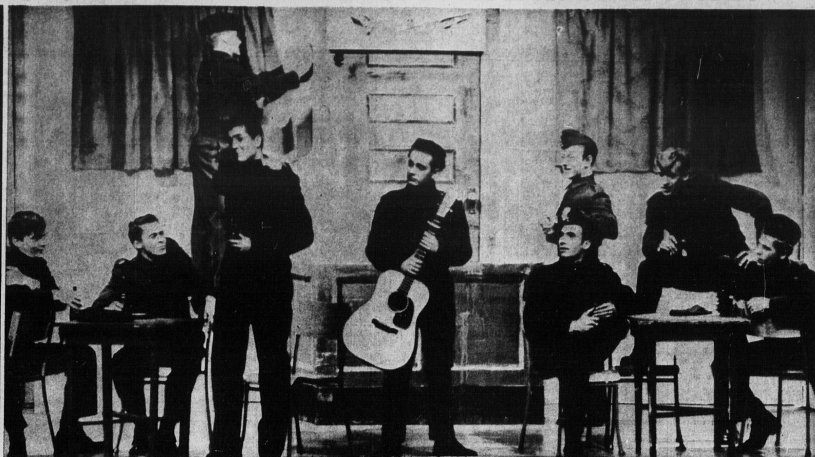

 Mr. MacDonald said "Mr. Hope-Wallace's past association with the D.D.F. and his wide experience with both French and English theatre, make him an excellent choice as final festival adjudicator."
 This will mark his fourth visit to Canada as he adjudicated the Dominion Drama Festival's final competition in Toronto in 1948, in Halifax in 1958 and in Vancouver in 1960.
 Mr. Moore noted with approval the specially valuable rehearsal and wardrobe rooms and various other items indicating the planners had done "all possible to make things comfortable for the performers backstage."
