GM Declares Findings Not Representative

DETROIT (AP)—General Motors Monday described as "wholly unwarranted" and "not fairly representative" of the hearings, the findings of Senate "big business" sub-committee last week.

The report questioned whether GM should be allowed to expand freely into any new fields; said GM should cut car prices and suggested further study by Congress and the justice department to see if action is called for to curb what it described as a trend toward monopoly by GM.

The General Motors statement Monday said the report "reflects the same emotional, rather than factual, approach to the case" that characterized the hearings themselves.

Production of Stoves, Furnaces Higher

OTTAWA (CP)—Production and shipments of most kinds of stoves and furnaces rose in February from the preceding month, the bureau of statistics reported Monday.

Output of solid fuel cooking stoves and ranges increased to 2,375 units from 1,890 and shipments to 1,638 units from 1,141 in January.

Output of gas cooking stoves and ranges rose to 2,097 units from 1,562 and shipments to 1,812 units from 1,121. Production of warm air furnaces decreased to 6,903 units from 7,506 and shipments to 5,311 units from 5,656 in the previous month.

Production of electric rangeettes rose to 3,202 units from 1,710 and shipments to 2,338 units from 1,323 in January.
