

# PM Says Maintaining Identity Difficult Canadian Problem

MONTREAL (CP) — Prime Minister Pearson said here it is not an easy task for Canadians, blanketed by the power, wealth and material appeal of 195,000,000 good American neighbors to maintain and strengthen a Canadian national identity.

He told the American Society of Newspaper Editors convention the task is especially difficult "when we also are subjected to the regional strains that are bound to exist in a federation, with constitutional divisions that at times coincide with racial or language differences.

"But we are going to achieve our national purpose, I assure you: build and maintain a strong, distinctive North American confederation which has its own values, its own loyalties, its own destiny."

Mr. Pearson said Canadians know the flow of United States capital into the country "is not the result of any foreign conspiracy, of grasping old-fashioned great power economic imperialism."

# French Tongue Handicapped In Saskatchewan

REGINA (CP) — The attitude of the press in Saskatchewan and the "clumsy" approach of the provincial education department to the teaching of French is turning young people against the language, a French-speaking group said here.

"In any such measures," he said, "the United States should remember that we are your largest market."

"It is a national feeling, more than national income that impels the great majority of Canadians to reject the notion of economic union with the United States. We think, and rightly, that political independence would not last long within any such framework."

He said the Canadian government will insist that subsidiaries of foreign corporations should act as good Canadian citizens, in law and in fact. In return, foreign capital and companies must be treated fairly.

# Unpaid Stockholders Roll Used To Get Shares Listed

TORONTO (CP) — Commodore Business Machines (Canada) Ltd. got its shares listed on the Canadian Stock Exchange by supplying lists of shareholders who never paid for shares, a royal commission was told here.

Bertrand Wolfman, an accountant working for the royal commission investigating last year's collapse of Atlantic Acceptance Corp., testified that Commodore's application for listing on the exchange was accepted in July, 1962, "subject to satisfactory proof of distribution."

The Canadian Stock Exchange requires that listed companies have enough shareholders to ensure the market for stocks will be relatively liquid.

Mr. Wolfman told the commission he discovered lists of persons who had Commodore shares registered in their names.

**NO PROOF OF PAYMENT**  
However, there was no indication that any of these persons had ever paid for the stock, he said.

In one case, 50 persons became owners of 100 Commodore shares each after the shares

Brother Philip John of St. Joseph's College, Yorkton, in a brief, questioned the power of a provincial legislature to obstruct the British North America Act.

Saskatchewan's school act says English shall be the only language of instruction in schools but allows school trustees to permit the teaching, not more than one hour a day, of the French language.

"No other provincial statute denies the duality of Canada's culture more bluntly than Saskatchewan's education act," he said.

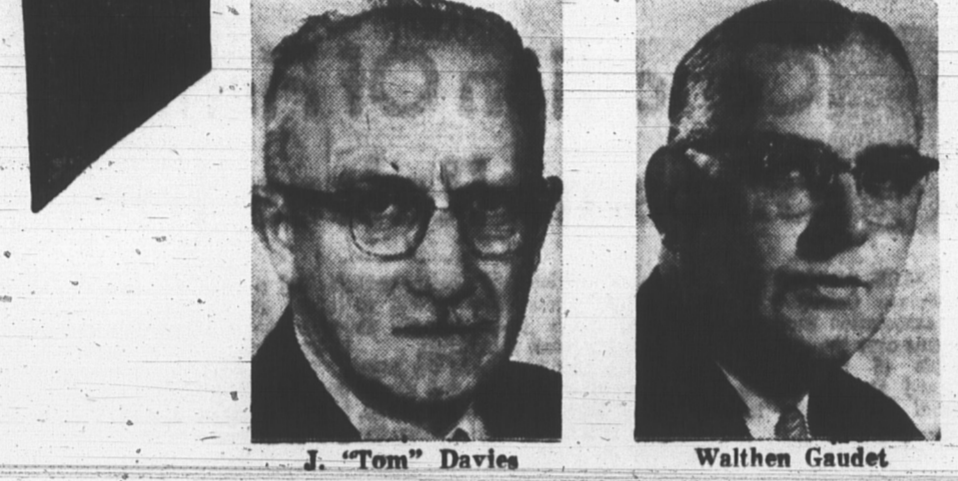

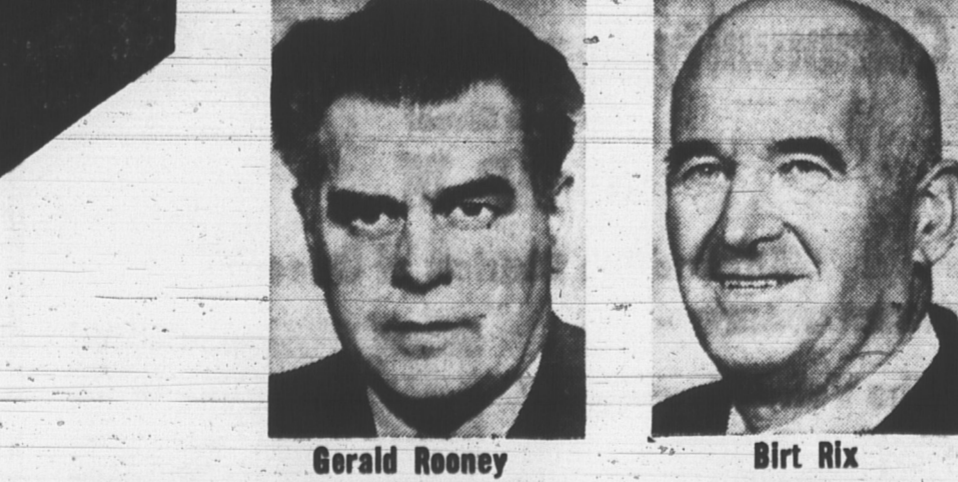

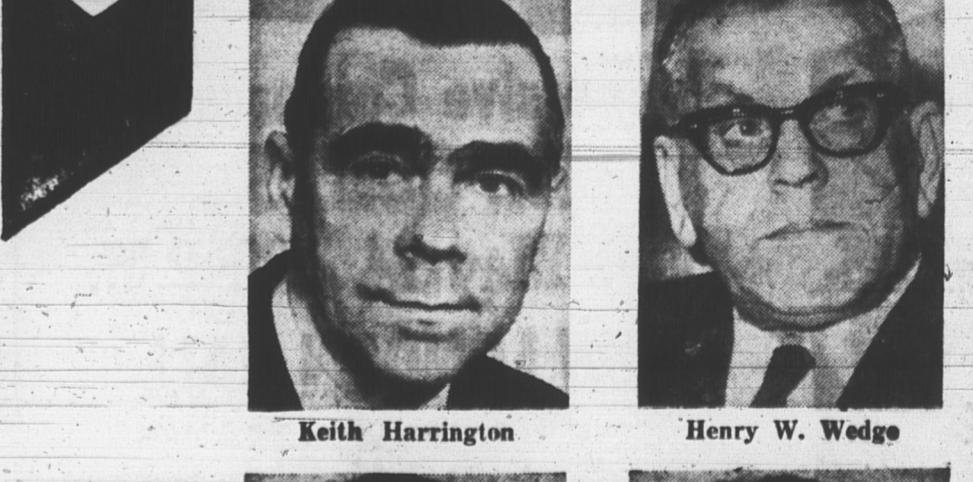
