MRS. TRENUMAN DEAD.

The many friends of Mrs. Benj. Rogers of Charlottetown, will sympathize with her in the loss of her mother, who died at Rochester, N. Y., on the 16th inst. Mrs. Rogers was with her mother at the time of her death. Speaking of the deceased lady the Rochester Democrat, at last this morning, says: Mrs. Caroline Trenuman, an aged and well known woman of this city, died on the evening of July 16th at her residence, No. 137 Court street, aged 79 years. YACHT RACE.

On next Thursday at 11 o'clock will be started what promises to be the best yacht race that has come off in Charlottetown harbor for many years. There are already seven entries, with a probability of several others. As before stated the course has been changed so that the yachts may be in full view of the wharves during the whole of the race. To-day expenses a limited number of tickets will be issued for the judge's boat, May Queen, which will follow the race. Already some of the boats are being prepared. Captain McMillan's fast cat-rigged boat, has been hauled up, painted, &c., at the foot of Prince street. Mr. Snellgrove has completed his work on the Paritan, and Mr. Joseph McCarey's new sloop is hauled up at the foot of Green Gully street. Mr. A. Peake's Maribel, O. R. T. boat, Mr. L. Moore's Alma have also been over hauled. Lieut. Governor Howland's fast sloop Nani will be taken ashore and given her final preparation to-day. The yachts will be moored at Connelly's wharf to-morrow (Tuesday) morning. Owners are requested to meet at Mr. Geo. Peake's office on Tuesday evening at 8 o'clock to make final arrangements for the race.

SEWERAGE.—To-morrow the people of Fredericton, N. B., will vote on the question of the adoption of the system of sewerage under the provisions of an act passed by the legislature at the last session. The estimated cost is one hundred thousand dollars for laying the mains, with additional for services. From the present feeling it is thought the vote will go strongly against the adoption of the system, as most of the ratepayers object to raising their taxes from an eighth to one-sixth besides the increased demands the system would entail upon householders.

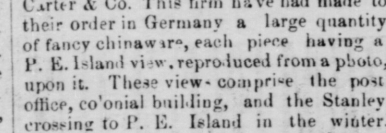

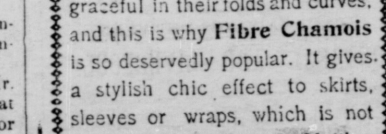
