**Court Cases At Georgetown**

**Says CPR Infringing On Rights Of House Members**

OTTAWA (CP) — CCF leader Coldwell Wednesday accused the Canadian Pacific Railway of attempting to infringe the rights of members of Parliament to free railway transportation.  
 Commons members applauded as Mr. Coldwell suggested that a letter from N. R. Crump, CPR vice-president, be ignored. The object of his criticism was a letter to the Commons clerk, Leon Raymond. Copies had been distributed to all members. Mr. Crump's letter referred to the fast new transcontinental train service starting April 24. R said the demand for passenger space likely will exceed space available on the new trains.  
 It noted that members of the Commons and Senate have statutory privileges to free railway transportation but asked that the members be advised of the necessity for ensuring that as far as possible the new trains be used for revenue passengers.  
 zMr. Coldwell said the request involves the privileges of all the members of Parliament.  
 To send such a letter, he said, is "an attempt to infringe the right we have under the railway act."
