- No. 13 All those portions of Townships Nos. 30 and 65 North of the following line, that is to say, commencing at the Appin Road at A. Ferguson's, thence West to Township No. 29, and East to Township No 31, at D. McArthur's, Township No. 65.
- No. 14 All those portions of Townships Nos. 30 and 65 bounded as follows, on the North by a line running from A. Ferguson's, on the Appin Road, thence West to Township No. 29, and East to Township No. 31, at D. McArthur's, Township No. 65, on the West by Township No. 29, South by Argyle Shore, East by Township No. 31 and the West River, and South-East by a line from the Head of Long Creek and along McEwen's Road to McNeill's, Canoe Cove.
