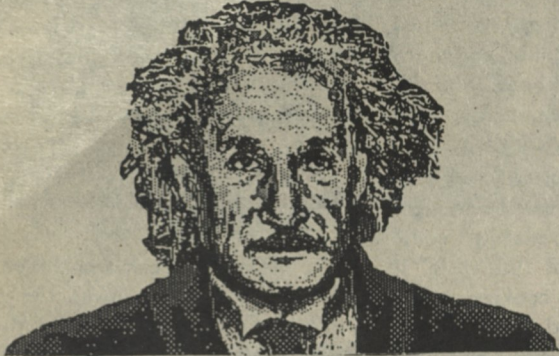
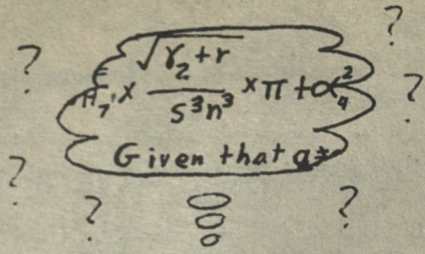


# Math&CS Welcome New Students

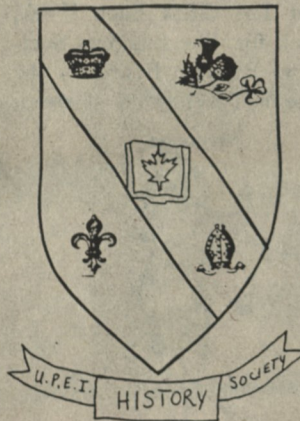

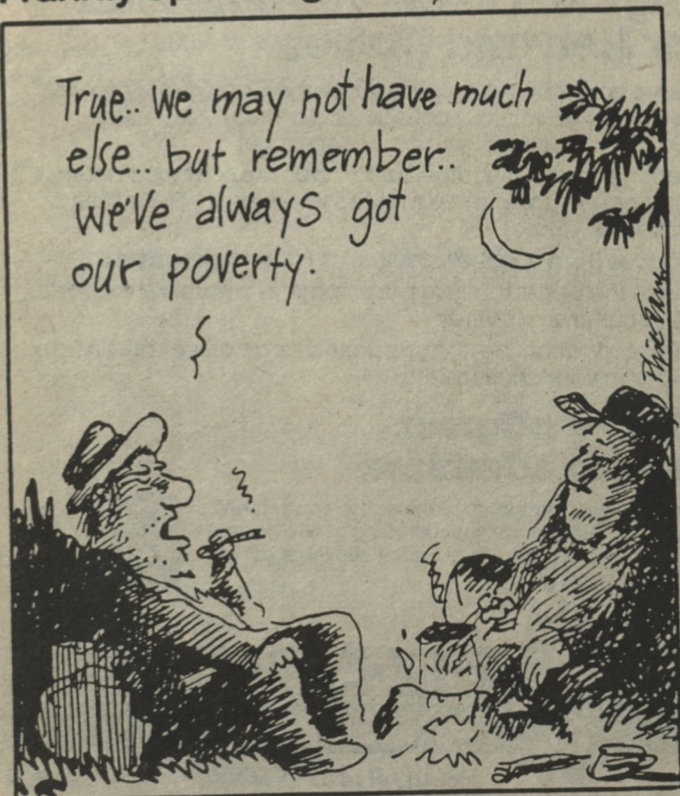
Will hold its first meeting of the fall semester on Wednesday, September 13, 1989 at 1:30pm in the History Lounge, Main 301.

All history majors are strongly urged to attend!

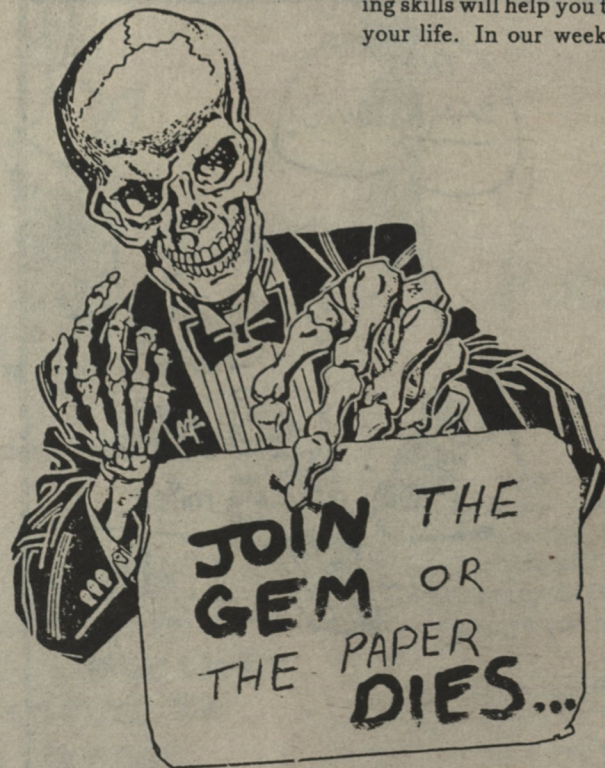
