SAVANNAH, Feb. 19. The dead bodies of two negroes were found tied to the foot of a sapling in the woods near this city this morning. They are thought to be brothers of John Graham, a crazy negro, who, it is believed, killed them as a sacrifice.

LOS ANGELES, Cal., Feb. 30. In the breach of promise suit, brought by Louis E. Perkins against E. J. Baldwin, the California millionaire, for \$500,000 damages, the jury to-day brought in a verdict in favor of the plaintiff for \$75,000.

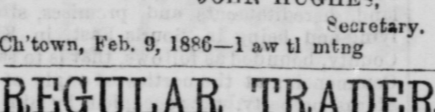
