

## Cardigan Catholic Church receives Valuable Gift

Through the generosity of Mr. James W. Shepard and his sister, Mrs. Hannah Dodge, Rev. J.P.E. O'Hanley informed his parishioners yesterday, "All Saints' Parish has received a most valuable Christmas gift consisting of a set of six marble candlesticks and a crucifix of Italian marble." The set will be used on the beautiful marble-and-stone main altar, which was designed, executed, and donated to the parish eighty-one years ago by the late William P. Lewis, the father of Mrs. W. M. Flynn, Charlottetown.

The candlesticks and crucifix are the work of Italian artists of the Gaffuri Paolo Marble Studios, Rezzato, Italy. The carved marble corpus of the crucifix is of unusual beauty of design and bears unmistakable marks of being the work of a master artificer.

In publicly thanking Mr. Shepard and Mrs. Dodge for "the most beautiful, most appropriate, and most valuable Christmas gift ever received by All Saints' Parish," Father O'Hanley stated that, in donating the set in memory of their parents and sister, they have erected a most worthy monument to the dear departed members of their family, and at the same time perhaps without their realizing it, they have erected to themselves a most enduring memorial that will proclaim for many long years after all of us have departed this life their love of the beauty of God's house and of the place where His Glory dwelleth.

## N. B. Health Act Will Require Amendment For Fluoridation Purposes

FREDERICTON, N.B. (CP)—Steps to make fluoridation of New Brunswick water legal were under consideration today following a judgment that, under the province's health act, such processing is illegal.

The judgment was delivered in the appeal division of the New Brunswick Supreme Court Thursday by Chief Justice J. B. McNair. One justice concurred and another dissented.

Hon. Dr. F. J. McInerney, minister of health and social services, said immediate consideration would be given to amending the health act and making fluoridation legal.

The matter was taken to court by protesting residents of Carleton ward after the Fredericton city council decided upon fluoridation as a means of alleviating dental decay.

The council decision was made last March but its implementation has been held in abeyance pending the outcome of legal action. The city's water supply is drawn from the St. John river and from wells.

Chief Justice McNair said in his judgment that according to the health regulations, materials used in fluoridation of water appear "dangerous substances to be handled with care."

He ruled that fluoridation was not covered by the health act section dealing with water purification. While addition of fluorine was not for the purpose of removing impurities, taking excess fluoride from a water supply might well be a purification procedure.

The death occurred at her home at Milltown Cross on Saturday of Mrs. John Wesley Jenkins in her 68th year following a short illness.

The deceased is survived by six sons and one daughter: George, Sturgeon; Wesley, Lott, Willis and Joseph at home; Wallace at Montague, and Rosella at home.

The funeral will be held today at 2:00 p.m. from Albion Baptist Church. Interment will be in Sturgeon cemetery.
