But there was a bitterness about the action of the Peking government and its militant young Red Guards organization in expelling the nuns, who had operated a convent-school in Peking. Most of them had been in China more than 40 years.

Nuns and priests here reported the nun who died, Sister Eamonn, 60, had had a high

fever for four days before being

forced to leave the Franciscan Sisters convent with seven companions, headed by the Canadian mother superior, 75-year-old Mother Mary of the Cross — formerly Winnifred Duff of Frampton, Que.

The Chinese officials made her go on the train," a priest said. "What she needed was care and treatment, not a long journey."

The Red Guards evicted the nuns charging that their convent was used as a cover for espionage and collusion with counter-revolutionaries in Catholic churches.

CARRIED ACROSS  
Sister Eamonn, the former Mary O'Sullivan from Cork, Ireland, was carried across the border into this British Colony on a baggage cart. The mother superior, who fainted at the border, was taken to hospital with Sister Eamonn.

The expelled nuns reported they had not had proper rest for eight days before reaching the border Wednesday, but were not physically mistreated.

Catholic sources said the seven survivors likely would rest before leaving for Rome. Unconfirmed reports said they might be received by the Pope.

In Quebec the vicar of the Franciscan community there said Mother Mary of the Cross left Quebec for China in 1918.

"Our members were in China before the Communists came to power, in 1949, and were resigned to dying at Sacred Heart School, which they did not leave except one day a year during which they had their passport and travel papers renewed," said Mother Marie of St. Lidore Wednesday.

She said Mother Mary would return to Quebec after a stop-over at the Mother House in Rome which administers the community of 12,000 members from 65 countries.

VATICAN CITY (AP) — The Vatican daily newspaper, "Osservatore Romano," added a front-page editorial note to a news report of the death of Sister Eamonn in Hong Kong. It said the nun had been exhausted by work, emotion, fear and lack of food and sleep.

The newspaper denounced Chinese communism as an "ideology which in its inexorable and progressive logic destroys even a last hope of religious liberty because it has no place for the rights of God and personal conscience."

Parole Board Will Decide Boyd Release

OTTAWA (CP) — The national parole board will decide Sept. 15 whether Amos Alonzo Boyd, once Canada's most-wanted criminal, is eligible for his second parole.

Last year, the board deferred release of the 52-year-old bank robber who broke out of jail twice after being charged with six bank holdups in 1951.

A wartime commando and former military policeman, Boyd broke out of Toronto's Don Jail Nov. 4, 1951, after he was convicted of the charges.

He was recaptured four months later and charged with two other bank jobs. He escaped from jail again on Sept. 8, 1952, was caught a month later, and sentenced to a life term in penitentiary at Kingston.

His first parole came after serving 10 years of the term, in October of 1962.

But he was back in Kingston four months later because of a series of parole violations, unauthorized debts and his association with a 16-year-old girl in Toronto.

Plane Facilities Lag On Ground

TORONTO (CP) — Ground aviation facilities are lagging far behind developments in the air and the situation may get worse, Gordon McGregor, president of Air Canada, said at a Canadian National Exhibition directors' luncheon here.

With the advent of supersonic jet travel, the "time getting through an airport could easily double the flight time on an international trip," he said.

Until ground problems are solved supersonic jets will not mean a great advance in air travel and Air Canada has no present plans to buy them.
