Garth Gay, pitching his first game in two years, slow-balled the R. C. A. F. Royals into submission at the Airforce diamond yesterday and Holman's defeated the Airmen 4 to 0. Gay allowed only two hits, both going to McKenzie, R. C. A. F. second sacker, who banked out a double and single in three trips to the plate. Holman's with five members of the Maritime champs on their line-up, fielded steadily behind Gay, the outfield handling the unusually large number of ten chances, and the infield coming up with sparkling defensive play to turn back the Royals' bid for tallies. Four errors, none costly, were divided between the pitcher and first baseman. Holman's garnered ten hits off Embrett, a southpaw who showed promise despite his defeat.
