Skyscraper Criticized

MONTREAL (CP) — A proposed 51-story skyscraper in the heart of downtown Montreal, is being criticized by architect Harry Mayerovich as "monstrous obstruction."

"Heaven preserve us," he told the annual meeting of the Province of Quebec Association of Architects, "from incongruous, sporadic growths unrelated to urban needs, unjustified by economic and determined by competition" venues at the most perille level, where the big is equated with the good.

The proposed skyscraper would reduce everything around it to pygmy status and endanger the sophisticated, old-world atmosphere of the city's financial district, he said.

He was referring to plans to build a three-unit giant on St. James Street at Victoria Square. Land already has been cleared for the first unit, which is completed by 1964. The skyscraper is to house the new offices of the Canadian and Montreal stock exchanges.

Presbyterian Minister Dies
TORONTO (CP) — Cameron Allard, a former Presbyterian minister at Pentecost, B.C., and Saint John, N.B., died in hospital here Friday following a lengthy illness. He was 48.

Mr. Allard was born in Maine, but moved to Canada at an early age. After graduating from Acadia University, Wolfville, N.S., and McGill Presbyterian College in Montreal, he became pastor of the Presbyterian Church in Pentecost.

From Pentecost he was called to St. Matthews Church in Saint John for two years.

For the past 17 years he had been employed by a Toronto advertising agency as a copy director.

He is survived by his wife, a brother Harold Allard of Paris, France, and a half-sister, Mrs. Jacqueline Dearboth of Prospect Heights, Ill.

Pilot Error Is Blamed In Dag Death
SALISBURY (Reuters) — A Rhodesian federal inquiry commission has ruled that the plane crash which killed Dag Hammarskjöld and 16 other persons was caused by a pilot's error.

A commission report said the pilot of the chartered Swedish DC-6B carrying the late United Nations secretary-general and his party allowed the plane to descend too low as it came in to land at Ndola Airport, Northern Rhodesia. Thus the plane hit trees and crashed, the three-man panel added.

The commission ruled out suggestions that the crash Sept. 17 last was caused by sabotage, a bomb on the plane or gunfire from the air or ground. At the time Hammarskjöld was flying from Leopoldville in The Congo to Ndola for "peace talks" with President Moise Tshombe of the Congo's secessionist Katanga province.

Fisheries Mission Has House Query
OTTAWA (CP) — Members of a fisheries trade mission now touring the Caribbean include those judged best able to report to the Canadian fishing industry on ways to boost sales to the area, Trade Minister Hees said in the Commons.

He was replying to Chesley W. Carter (L. — Burn-Burgeo) who asked why the mission did not include a producer representative. The Newfoundland MP noted fish buyers and exporters were represented on the mission.

Mr. Hees said there is one representative of the trade from Newfoundland, Nova Scotia and Quebec.

Prison Printing To Be Expanded
OTTAWA (CP) — Prisoners in the federal penitentiary at Kingston, Ont., handled the printing of a recent annual report by the commissioner of penitentiaries, Justice Minister Fulton told the Commons.

He said this work by the prison printing shop will be expanded to handle more of the justice department's printing needs.

Mr. Fulton was replying to a question by Frank Howard (C.F. — Skeena) who congratulated the minister on the idea.

KILL 4 FUGITIVES
KATMANDU, Nepal (Reuters) — Police and army units have shot and killed four and recaptured 89 of some 100 prisoners who escaped from a jail at Palpa, South Nepal, last Sunday, officials here said Saturday. The prisoners broke out when guards relaxed their vigilance of fears that a planetary conjunction meant the end of the world.
