EDITORIAL

God only knows that students don't want to hear about A.F.S. (the Atlantic Federation of Students). Well, this is not directly about A.F.S. but rather about money.

Last Spring, the U.P.E.I. Student Union held a referendum concerning its joining A.F.S. If the majority of voters said yes, the Student Union would join and each student would have to pay an extra dollar on their student fee which was to be sent to A.F.S.

Was to be sent. The vote was yes. We have paid the dollar. And the money was to be sent.

This does mean that as of yet the money has not been sent. \$1550, one dollar for each of us, has not been given to an institute that is having financial problems because Student Unions aren't sending them money designated for them.

Council does not want to spend the money because of problems A.F.S. was having. But it was Council that informed students concerning A.F.S. so they would be educated voters. Council, therefore, should not (and as far as I can determine, does not) have the right to withhold these funds. So what's been happening?

For once the students have become directly involved in the business of the Student Union; and what happens? They ignore us. These are the people we voted for, believing they would do what the student body wants. In other words, we are their bosses.

"You can shit on my head, but don't shit on my feet". This is what is being done to us. If the Student Council decides not to pay A.F.S., they are doing just what their bosses told them not to do. They are ignoring what we said in the referendum.

Imagine if the Council decided we didn't know what was going on when we voted George McGibbon as president. They might have put poor George in a trust fund. The referendum should be just as decisive as that election.

The constitution of the Student Union does not take such matters as funds allocated for special organizations into account. In the new constitution (when it comes about) this should be put in. But until that time, Council should not even consider doing anything with such money except what is supposed to be done with it.
