Island Odds and Ends

Because less dairy cattle were sold out of this Province last year than in the immediate preceding years, the production of dairy products is rising on the island. The year 1953 was a year of record production, but given good pasturage, say officials in the Provincial Department of Agriculture, 1954 will surpass it. With the support price for butter still operative and stabilizing the market, prospects for a fairly good year for dairying are promising.

The Charlottetown Driving Park, better known perhaps as "the Exhibition Grounds" is beginning to reassert its seasonal attraction as a recreation centre. Almost every day now, horses are being "worked" if the weather permits, and many local citizens get as much kick from watching the workouts, as they do watching the actual racing later in the year. Besides, there is the fun of listening to the track gossip and arguments, always on tap around the stables.

Naturally, every effort will be directed towards making Charlottetown's Centennial year, 1955, the most memorable in the city's history. The celebration should be a great magnet for former islanders and for tourists, who have never before visited our shores. It is good to know that steps are already being taken to plan the big event. The celebration could be of such advertising value as to yield dividends in tourist dollars for years to come.

It is astonishing how quickly some of the clay roads on the island have improved with a little sun treatment, plus drying winds and an occasional scraping by Government equipment. For more than a week now, trout fishermen have been motoring into East Lake and North Lake over surprisingly good roads. Thus far, it is said the roads have been better than the fishing. As to the latter, it should improve in both lakes, and that very shortly. All of the better catches were taken from these two spots in early May last year, although some catches were made in April.

Quebec City Wants Second Air Strip

QUEBEC (CP) —Delegates from Quebec City chamber of commerce will submit a brief to Prime Minister St. Laurent and Transport Minister Chevrier in Ottawa May 3, asking for construction of a second air landing strip 6,000 feet long at nearby Ancienne Lorette airport.

The chamber will request construction of an airport station for passengers and freight. The chamber will urge that Trans-Canada Air Lines planes

bound for overseas destinations and New York be established, and make a stop here; that regular service between Quebec, Boston and New York be established, and that a Quebec-Paris service be organized.

POTATO GROWERS ATTENTION

The attention of potato growers is directed to the provisions of the "Prince Edward Island Potato Act" which requires that "no person shall plant potatoes in the Province of Prince Edward Island unless the seed used is of the class Foundation or Certified, as determined by the official inspections carried out by the Plant Protection Division, Science Service, Dominion Department of Agriculture. Provided, however, that this section shall not apply to potato crops, which, in the aggregate, on an individual property, do not exceed one acre, unless by proclamation of the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council otherwise.

FURTHER all potato crops shall be subject to inspection as follows:
(a) Subject to conformity with the regulations governing the production of certified seed potatoes, crops planted with Foundation seed with a view to seed certification, may be inspected by the Plant Protection Division, Dominion Department of Agriculture.

(b) Potato crops including those planted with seed of the "Certified" class with a view to tablestock production shall be inspected for bacterial ring rot, or any other disease or insect pest as may be determined from time to time, by inspectors duly authorized by the Prince Edward Island Department of Agriculture.

Each potato grower shall be required to register each field of potatoes for inspection as follows:

(a) If for seed potato production, applications shall be submitted to the District Seed Potato Inspector, Dominion Department of Agriculture.

(b) If for tablestock production, application shall be submitted to the Prince Edward Island Department of Agriculture.

In accordance with the Certified Seed Potato Regulations each grower who applies for inspection of his crop for seed purposes shall be required, among other qualifications, to supply proof of the planting of seed of the Foundation class in the field for which inspection is requested. All other growers shall be required to supply proof of the purchase of certified seed used for planting the potato crop.

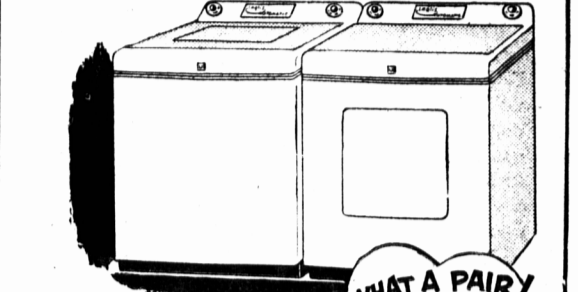
Each grower shall exercise the necessary care in the planting, cultivation, spraying, dusting, or harvesting, of his potato crop to avoid any possible contamination with bacterial ring rot through machinery, harvesting containers, storage or second hand bags.

Failure to comply with any of these regulations shall result upon summary conviction to a fine not exceeding \$100.00 or in default of payment to imprisonment for a term not exceeding thirty days or both.

All growers purchasing and planting Certified or better in 1953, and whose potato production from that planting in that year was classified as tablestock will be required under this Act to secure for planting in 1954 Certified Seed or better.
