THE COOK'S CORNER Lemon Snow Balls 3 eggs 1 cup fruit sugar 2 tablespoons water Juice and grated rind 1-2 lemons 1 cup flour 1 teaspoon baking powder Method: Beat the egg yolks with the sugar and add the water, lemon juice and grated rind. Sift the flour, measure and sift again with the baking powder. Add these and then fold in the stiffly beaten egg whites. Turn into well greased custard cups and steam for 30 minutes over boiling water.

Lemon Sauce 2 cups hot water 1 cup sugar 3 tablespoons cornstarch Juice and rind of lemon 1 tablespoon butter Method: Mix the sugar and cornstarch and pour the hot water over them. Cook in a double boiler for 15 or 20 minutes; then remove and add the lemon juice, grated rind and butter. Cool slightly and serve over the hot snow balls.

Bananas Mocha Dessert 4 slices buttered bread 3 ripe bananas 1 cup hot, strong coffee 3 tablespoons cream 1 cup brown sugar Method: Bread toast it at least a day or so old is best for this. Butter it generously and trim off the crusts. Have the bread cut about 1-2 inch thick, then cut it into 1 inch cubes. Arrange in a buttered baking dish in layers with the sliced bananas and a pour over all the coffee to which has been added the cream and brown sugar. Bake in a moderate oven, 350 deg. F. oven for about 45 minutes, until the pudding is sweetened whipped cream.
